From the Pastor...

This month we celebrate the event which makes us Christian - the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Although our culture places greater emphasis on Jesus' birth at Christmas, our celebration is to be greatest at Easter for it is by his resurrection that we understand the depth of God's love and power. We are "resurrection people" who are to be very glad, but sometimes we limit our celebration. Our pious roots suggest that there is not to be too much merriment, except on Easter Sunday.

This thought was very striking to me while watching a video in the "God We Can Know" Lenten series. The video showed actual footage of the Jewish Festival of Booths or Sukkot (pronounced SOOK-ut) that begins on the fifth day of Yom Kippur. This festival is similar to our national Thanksgiving holiday which gives God thanks for a bountiful harvest. It is a nine-day festival during which temporary "booths" are created and plenty of food, music, and dancing are found.

Do we as Christians still remember to dance? To help us remember to celebrate, our worship theme for the Easter season will be "Dare to Dance Again." During this season, we will be celebrating how we "dance" together as the Body of Christ gathered here. As any dancer knows, in order to dance well, one needs to know and trust the partners. We will celebrate that with our many different "rhythms" and "steps" we choose to dance well together. By dancing together, we can experience and exhibit the joy that is ours as God's loved and forgiven children.

May we dance like no one is watching! May we dance with the joy which is ours to share as Christ's resurrection people! May we let the greater community know how being together enhances our lives!

A Message from the Council President

EVERYTHING INTERGENERATIONAL

I write this column on a week between trips to Honduras. Last week I was with 22 pre-med students from Vanderbilt University, and next week—the week of March 15—I'm with 12 pre-meds from F&M. Both colleges have been with CARE in Honduras for at least the last five years. From year to year, I've looked forward to spending a LOT of time with the college-aged students. I've learned over the past five years that CARE is privileged to have 'the cream of the crop' come to Honduras for medical missions.

On some evenings, after a long day at a rural village clinic, the students gather and reflect on the day's experiences. On the last night before returning to the States, it has become "tradition" to reflect and share each individual's highs and lows of the week, and what they're taking back for their future. I am consistently moved by the honesty and heartfelt discussions.

Church of the Apostles has the rich opportunity to explore and develop relationships among the generations who are members. Just as I've been enriched by contact with "younger" members of COA—and there are a LOT of "youngers" than I am at COA—I've also been excited about the enthusiasm they show about their faith and their church. We're certainly not peas in a pod!

Welcoming new ideas and suggestions has been a valuable asset to the work CARE does in Honduras, allowing fresh ideas and opinions from the younger members of clinic teams has resulted in tweaking our clinic procedures—with effective

results. I've learned that being "younger" does not mean less astute; there may not be the "years of experience", but there certainly is the ability to observe, analyze, and suggest new approaches. I've learned to listen to those comments, as one can easily narrow one's vision without the benefit of others' suggestions.

Intergenerational contacts and activities at Church of the Apostles is much like our "Seeds of Hope" garden: we plan for the sowing of seeds [ideas], make the efforts to nurture the plants [younger members], provide the nutrition [encouragement] for growth, and enjoy the harvest [successful relationships among all members].

Recently, Steve and Monica Daniels had a group of about eight "young people" at their cabin for a weekend. Their comments about the weekend were more than positive, and their experience with "those young people" was deep and meaningful! Among many other positive reactions, the Daniels were deeply impressed by the easy camaraderie that quickly developed among EVERYONE at the cabin.

As seeds were planted—and nurtured—at the Daniels', so can seeds be planted and nurtured with those members of Church of the Apostles by EVERYONE's willingness to be Intergenerational:


Giving Report for February 2015

In the month of February, our giving was almost \$4,000 more than last year. There were some income items that arrived late and didn't get deposited until March, so that ate up a good deal of the increase. In addition to that, the commission's expenses rose \$2,000 over the same time period as last year. The end result was a negative balance of \$5,737.54. The exact numbers are: operating revenue of \$74,187.50 compared to expenses of \$79,925.04 for a balance of (\$5,737.54). The totals for the same period last year were \$73,991.77 in total revenue and \$77,791.28 in total expenses.

The Education Commission has approved the purchase of three new books for Apostles Library as a follow-up to the recently offered study of "The Jesus Fatwah". The books are:

- ◆ The Search for Truth About Islam: A Christian Pastor Separates Fact From Fiction by Ben Daniel, a Presbyterian pastor from San José, California.
- ◆ A Vanished World: Muslims, Christians, and Jews in Medieval Spain by Chris Lowney, a former Jesuit

seminarian who later served as a Managing Director for JP Morgan & Co on three continents.

- ◆ The Islamophobia Industry: How the Right Manufactures Fear of Muslims by Nathan Lean, Editor-in Chief of Asian Media and a contributing writer at PolicyMic.

In addition, we have received several copies of the Quran written in modern English donated to Church of the Apostles by the Islamic Center of Lancaster. Please feel free to borrow these books.
