With the presidential primaries, there has been more talk by the media and the candidates about God, faith, and beliefs recently. Several of the candidates have declared their positions on issues as based on their religious values, and I hear an undertone of "If you elect me, this country will be run as God had intended it to be." While that sentiment is very appealing, that did not seem to be part of Jesus' intentions nor of the early church. Actually, the early church was on the margins as it chose to place its allegiance in God rather than Rome. While Rome was interested in wealth and power, Jesus and the early church knew their power was in their weakness and sought to meet the needs of others. They lived this by reaching out to those with whom Romans and the Jewish authorities would not associate to let them know they were loved and valued by God. They reached out to the "invisibles" of their society. The questions for us as a congregation are: Who are the invisibles in Lancaster County in 2016? How are we reaching out to them? Are there any in our congregation?

It has long been said that Sunday morning is the most segregated time of the week and yet, according to Paul's writing, the early church was about inclusion. It was about realizing that "What God has made clean, you must not call profane." The church was God's great social experiment to see if people with many differences could unite under a commitment to live faithfully to God, even if it went against the popular culture of the time. The early church did not reflect the values of the culture. It reflected God's values, but this is a loaded question as Christians interpret the Bible very differently.

As your Senior Pastor, it is my goal to look for the "invisibles" in our congregation and in our community. Within our congregation, the Worship Commission and I want our worship services to be accessible to all, so we need to hear from those who struggle to participate or understand what we are doing. We particularly want to connect with those who are unsure if they fit in here. During the season of Easter, we will be focusing on the early church through the Book of Acts and looking specifically at the role of grace, love, newness, holiness, table and flourishing within the Body of Christ.

By now, you might have heard some talk about an application called "The City" and how Church of the Apostles (COA) plans to use this new form of communication. So what is The City? The City is a private online community where church members can join groups, build relationships, and find new ways to connect and do ministry together. This application will give us a unified platform to share church news, announcements, group or direct messages, volunteer opportunities, needs, prayer requests, etc.

Here are a few ways everyone at COA will use The City:

- To keep accurate contact information: The most exciting feature of The City is its ability to sync with ACS, so you will be able to update your contact information on The City whenever something changes and COA's records will be automatically be updated too. You will be able to look up other members' phone numbers if they choose to share that information.
- To manage events: All event details from the planning process to registration to follow-up can be managed in one place.
- To manage a shared calendar: Members will be kept updated on what's going on with calendars to

- organize meetings, events, and other group activities.
- To keep everyone in the loop: When you post something on The City, your message will get to the right individual or group the way they prefer to receive it – via email or a mobile notification on their phone.
- To serve each other: The City gives members a way
 to extend a helping hand to those in need. Do you
 need a ride to church? A meal delivered? Help
 moving? Members will be able to sign up to help meet
 each other's needs.
- And much more...

We are in the process of completing the steps on our end that need to be finalized in order to officially launch The City. Within the next two weeks, you will be receiving an email invitation to become a member of The City. Please look out for this email, and remember to check your spam/junk mail folders too. The sign-up process is simple – just use the link in the email to create an account with your contact information. We will then send you additional invitations to join any church groups or teams you are a member of. Once you sign up, feel free to browse The City to learn more about it.

In order to help answer any questions, we will also set up a few demonstration sessions after services so that you can see how The City works. We will notify you of the dates once they are determined.

Giving Report for February 2016

February was a substantially better month financially for Church of the Apostles than January this year. We have contributions of \$4,867.23 more this month than the same month last year, a wonderfully positive trend. Unfortunately, our expenses have increased by \$2,993.26 over last year. We find ourselves in a small deficit of \$3,863.57.

The actual numbers are: revenues of \$79,054.73 for this year and \$74,187.50 for last year. The expenses also trended up with \$82,918.30 for this year and \$79,925.04 for last year. It is too early in the year to see any kind of trend developing, but because our pledged amounts for 2016 increased, we should see a positive trend in our income for the year.

Missionary Support

The missionary that our church supported in the past is retiring. Outreach decided

on a new missionary this year—one who is working in Honduras. Honduras was a strong mission in the past for the Evangelical and Reformed Church, which included our two past churches: St. John's and St. Paul's. The Evangelical and Reformed Church in Honduras

remains, having not merged into the UCC. This mission site is not too far from Andy Appel's mission.

Maryjane and Donald Westra are members of a UCC church in Minnesota, but now serve the Evangelical and Reformed Church of Honduras. Their mission is to work with a vocational school (CEVER) which relates work to spiritual and moral development. The student ages range from 14 to 30.

Don thought his background as a business owner, mechanical engineer, and farm kid would fit with a vocational schools are important in Honduras where unemployment is 40-50%. The fear is that the country's youth will be swallowed up by the gangs. Fear is prevalent and finding enough to eat in the arid areas is a full-time job with clean water also being hard to find in the country. CEVER's greatest challenge is funding. We can help with that.



Talking about sex with the young people in your life is not easy!

- Many of us feel uncomfortable even *thinking* about having that conversation with our children or grandchildren.
- Sexual imagery and messages are everywhere in our 21st-century culture.
- Yet, real and honest conversations are few and far between.
- And while many parents think of a one-time conversation for the tween years, children start learning about sexuality as soon as they're born.
- By the time many parents are ready to "talk," kids already have lots of information *much of it inaccurate, misleading, or less-than-positive*.

 In this workshop, we will explore our discomfort around sex and learn some age-

appropriate strategies for turning "the talk" into a lifelong conversation about sexuality and health, whether your children are preschoolers or high-schoolers.

Kelly Gainor, a Community Health Educator for Planned Parenthood Keystone, serving Lancaster, Dauphin, Cumberland, and York counties, will lead this workshop. Kelly provides medically-accurate sexuality education to students of all ages, and is the coordinator of an LGBTQA+ (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, Asexual) youth program, called The Curve which meets on Thursdays in York. She has a Master's Degree in Human Sexuality Education from Widener University and has presented at several sexuality conferences, including the National Sex Ed Conference in New Jersey.
