As I write this article, I am sitting on the beautiful campus of Elmhurst College as part of the United Church of Christ Musician's Association's biannual conference in which the pastor and church musician's relationship is being explored. Although I very much appreciate the relationship I have with both Cindy Kahler, our Director of Music Ministries, and Nate Sheffer, our Director of Adult Choir & Instrumental Music, I am learning how important a healthy relationship is to the health of the congregation. As we - the staff responsible for leading worship each week - enjoy working and worshipping together, we are in a better position to create worship which "feeds" others. I believe we have a great team to do this!

There has been much written over the last decade about the "worship wars" over style of music and worship. We see the mega-churches with their rock bands and full auditoriums and we grieve that our pews are not full; however, as many churches have found, it is not just about adopting the style that will draw the people. I also think it is significant that, in spite of their success, there is still a large portion of our community attending no church at all, yet holding a belief in God. Some of these people have been hurt by church communities because they did not "measure up" to the standards or were "not worthy" of the congregation's love. What an incredibly sad statement of affairs!

Instead of looking at who we may draw from another congregation, I think we are called to reach out to those who are looking for a faith community, but want one which reminds them that they are a child of God, regardless of what society says. If they, themselves, are not hurting, they may be looking for one where their friends who have been rejected are also welcome. Yes, I am very carefully asking us to consider welcoming people of color, people of same-sex orientation, and those with disabilities. Our greater community includes all these people. So what would it be like to welcome them into our congregation?

On Sunday, August 16, we will have a "very casual" Sunday where you are invited to come in your t-shirts and shorts. If you have a 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary t-shirt, please wear it. At the sermon time, I will invite you to share discerned thoughts about how we might "feed the hungry." We will also have an extended fellowship time between services for fellowship. This is meant to be a time for sharing thoughts and celebrating how we continue to be "Sharing Christ and His Love with All People."

## Giving Report for June 2015

At the six-month point in the year, it's getting easier to project our financial position for 2015. While our June income statement shows a loss of \$24,930.17 because we have not yet transferred our earned interest for the year, we are doing far better than our budget predicted. Our budgeted need for using investment money at the end of the year will be substantially less than expected.

The actual numbers for June are: \$222,799.89 in total income and \$247,730.06 in total expenses; that gives us the net loss of \$24,930.17. Last year at this time, our income was higher with \$234,028.28 in total income and \$243,298.89 of total expenses for a loss of only \$9,270.61.



The Stewardship commission is actively working on next year's budget, so if you have any comments you would like to share with us, please don't hesitate. We welcome any and all help.

### A Gem in Rader Park

If you haven't been down to Rader Park recently, you might not know how much is going on there. When the Property Commission made a list of active programs and a list of the park features, it was very impressive indeed. Couple that with all the groups and organizations that are involved with the park, and it becomes clear what an asset we have on our lower campus.

Programs for the first six months of this year have included: Vacation Bible School, Wacky Wednesday, Camp Cool, Apostles Preschool Summer Camp, and the Ecological Programs for City School children. That amounts to a lot of children being touched by our church. We salute all the volunteers who took part in these very worthwhile programs and look forward to the programs continuing.


The list of the park's physical features are impressive too, and they allow for people of all ages to participate in programs that vary from passive enjoyment of nature to hard work in the garden. These features include: the pond, butterfly garden, pine grove, honey bees, tree nursery, groomed areas, not-so-groomed areas, memorial trees, garden plots for rent, Seeds of Hope garden, walking trails, Brubaker Run, milkweed habitat, chestnut tree seedling trail, raised bed gardens, teaching gardens, composting, and the soon-to-be-built rain garden. It's hard to find many areas the size of Rader Park that offer so much.

Think of all the people that are touched by having access to the park! In addition to our church members and the Homestead residents, we also enjoy the involvement of the Brownies who meet in the youth center and perform services in the park, and the Town and Country Garden Club members who are generously

volunteering their time to reinvigorate the Butterfly Garden. The biggest impact, however, is probably to the community and our neighbors who use the park on a daily basis, walking their dogs and using our rented garden plots to grow food for their families.



### Lancaster British Brass Band

The Lancaster British Brass Band, now in their 11<sup>th</sup> year of existence, will be performing at Church of the Apostles on Thursday, August 6 at 7:00 p.m. Known as an extremely popular musical ensemble within the Central Pennsylvania Region, the group consists of a fixed 28-piece instrumentation that is often said to sound like a "magnificent pipe organ."

The repertoire for this concert will include: *Symphonic Highlights from "Frozen,"* arranged by Stephen Bulla, *Hometown Miniatures* by Drew Fennell, *With Clouds Descending* by Philip Sparke, and the featured composition for the evening, *Windows of the World* by Peter Graham.

"Windows of the World" was commissioned by The Yorkshire Building Society (YBS) Band. This piece is a 4



six-movement sequel to Graham's popular brass band composition "Cry of the Celts," and it reflects world music styles from Latin American to Irish Folk. The individual movements are: Amazonia, Rainforest, The Rising Sun, Drums of Thunder, Celtic Dream, and Earth Walk. The work provides solo opportunities for several principal players, including Soprano Cornet, Trumpet/ Cornet, Flugel Horn, Tenor Horn, Baritone, Trombone, Euphonium and Percussion. Windows of the World was also premiered by the YBS Band at the Millennium European Championships Gala Concert, held in Symphony Hall Birmingham.

Peter Graham will take the audience first to Latin America, then to Japan and onwards to Saharan Africa. We get a gentle reprieve via a nostalgic hint of the British Isles before we land in the melting pot of all styles, the USA. In this final section, the driving swing section is abruptly stopped and a drum cadenza leads us back into the opening Latin music.

There is no cost for the concert, however, there will be a free-will offering taken during intermission. Reserved seating is not available, so please arrive early to secure your seat.
