Dear Friends,

As we look forward to what will be the last month of enjoying the summer weather and the opportunities it brings, do not forget the opportunities at Apostles! On August 5, we will have an all-church camp service and potluck down at Rader Park as part of our all-church campout. It will take place at the Schellenberger Pavilion, so it will be accessible for all who wish to join. Back by popular demand, we will play Church Family Feud—facilitated by Andy Smith! Bring a dish to share and your lawn chairs for this fun event.

The youth are continuing to make progress in improving the Youth Center this summer with painting and taking in donations of furniture. However, we do not have enough funds for the much-needed replacement of the flooring. We also have the needs of replenishing our capital maintenance fund and replacing the sound system. As football season is beginning again this month, I am putting out a challenge not just for the youth, but for the entire congregation. Most of you know that I am a loyal Ohio State fan, having been born on the campus and my dad working there for 26 years. The cash flow for four months ending June 2017 was negative (\$67,937.40). Operating Expenses through June 2017 were \$289,194.13, Revenue \$221,256.73. We began the year with \$1,947,407.85 in endowment funds and the end June balance was \$1,909,603.63.

Council Meeting Minutes — June 19, 2017

Devotions: Clara read an essay on using prayer and faith through difficult times.

Minutes were approved: Conner/Herb

Treasurers Report:

The preschool donation is paid quarterly and now is included under rentals as 10% of all rental income goes into the capital maintenance fund. Members receive a 10% discount in preschool.

There should be a new conduit for TLC. Money should be collected and then one check written.

Commission Reports:

Education: Vacation Bible School is underway June 18-22. 45 children are registered. They meet in the park unless it is raining. The theme is "Digging for Treasure."

Outreach: The garden is growing fast and four containers of lettuce, spinach and snap peas were taken to the food pantry this morning.

Parish Life: The annual meeting in November was discussed and each commission will be asked to provide some food. The group is looking for someone to clean the kitchen.

Worship: They recommend an exciting Sunday morning around the Annual Meeting in November. It would start in Fellowship Hall where the Annual Meeting business could proceed and commissions would give reports of their work through the year. Food would be served during that time. At 10:30 people would walk to the sanctuary. Nate would like to have an orchestra with all the choirs participating during the worship service in the sanctuary. The Council approved the idea.

The sound system is ordered. The cost was covered

by commissions, the academy and private donations.

Property: During this month the heat pumps were repaired and all are now working. Eric worked on the fountain in the memorial garden but it still is not working properly. A new one will be bought to replace it. There is a work day on Saturday at the Youth Center. The youth will be painting.

Stewardship: No questions on money.

Pastor Heather's Report: She is back from vacation and is involved in youth planning over the long term. She was with a group of six families for a cookout. The theme was about parents teaching kids about faith. It was suggested that grandparents could participate in sharing their faith as well.

Pastor Kathy's Report: The Growth Task Force submitted a list of ideas. The group gives energy and ideas for ways to improve. One idea is to have more communication between the council and members. Andy A. volunteered to see that new name tags for Council members would be a different color and would ask - How may I help you?

Discussion was held regarding Appreciative Inquiry. During the sabbatical, small groups can discuss four questions about the important parts of church that impact their faith. When Pastor Kathy is back she will hold groups at different times of the day for those who have not had the opportunity to address the questions. Themes should surface during the discussions that will help us move on with our mission.

The Council reviewed the contract for Haan Phelps who will assist with several ministerial duties during the sabbatical. Aside from Rev. Phelps and Rev. Giffen, other speakers are expected during the summer.

Old Business:

Capital Campaign: There is a need for a capital maintenance campaign that can accomplish the many things that need to be repaired or replaced. It would cover the maintenance items in the present, such as the repaving, and other big items that will be needed later. Stewardship would like to focus on the parking lot and the Capital Maintenance Campaign for now.

Usually it is recommended that a long term maintenance fund should be 20% of the average budget. All commissions need to be involved.

Nominating Committee for Council: Linda Lewis put together a council nominating committee of 10 with five present members and five members at large. The Council members are: Connor Braun, Christa Conrad, Cathy Kenlin, Linda Lewis, and Andy Smith. The five members at large are George Alspach, Allison Carr, Glenn Ebersole, Arlene Gaudioso, and Judy Waltman.

Transitional Learning Center




