The weather in February often prohibits people from getting out with others, and we can get caught in “destructive webs” of our own making. For this reason, the Worship Commission and Worship Design Team have chosen to offer specific items to help.


On Wednesday, February 8, we will offer a Service of Healing and Hope at 7 pm in the Sanctuary, particularly for those who have experienced a loss or are feeling sad, angry, or lonely. This will be a contemplative service of scripture readings, prayer, music, and anointing for those who wish. It is during the dark moments of our lives that people who do not know much about the church are willing to consider how God may help, and we have good news for them. We know that God can be most present with us in those dark times. If you know of anyone for which this would be helpful, please invite them to attend and be willing to accompany them.

Our worship theme for Lent is “Gifts of the Dark Wood” based on the book by Eric Elnes. On Sunday mornings, we will introduce topics such as “The Gift of Uncertainty,” “The Gift of Getting Lost,” and “The Gift of Temptation,” among others. On Wednesday evenings during March and the beginning of April, we will explore these topics more deeply and have time to share with one another our thoughts and wisdom. Please consider attending these sessions and invite others of whom you know who may benefit from hearing good news about God’s love, grace, and guidance in the midst of the darkness.

May we be a source of God’s light and love to our community!



Giving Report for December 2016

The final numbers for the year 2016 are in, and, as always, there is good news and bad news. While our offerings fell short of our projected numbers, it was only by \$3,000. The positive news is that we increased our total revenues over the prior year for the first time since 2012. Our revenue for 2016 was \$491,130 as opposed to 2015, which was \$475,618.

The expense side of the budget had good and bad news too. Our expenses were \$61,465 less than our budget expected. However, they were \$58,896 more than last year. Our actual expenses for 2016 were \$592,967 and for last year, only \$534,071. What all these numbers mean is that the year 2016 created a deficit of \$101,836. Here again, good news and bad news. We had a deficit, but it was considerably less than we expected. Our budget showed an expected loss of \$147,850.

It is too early to know whether the good news is the beginning of a new trend or not. If next year we experience the same pieces of good news, we will all begin to celebrate. Let us all redouble our efforts to give a lot and spend a little so we can celebrate a new beginning. The Stewardship Commission would like to thank all of you who gave so generously to the church we all love.



Council Meeting Minutes —December 19, 2016

Following a social time with refreshments, the meeting was called to order by Robert Reiff, President.

Devotions: Andy Smith offered devotions on leadership.

Welcome: Bob Reiff welcomed new Council member Christa Conrad. As a member of the young families group, her insight will be valuable in representing a demographic of the congregation that is not currently involved on Council.

Minutes from the November 21, 2016 Council meeting were approved as written (Berkow, Kosmela).

Election of Council Officers

The following officers were elected for 2017:

President - Steve Daniels

Vice-President - Cathy Kenlin (with help from others after August)

Secretary - Carol Nielsen

Treasurer - Andy Smith (this is an appointed rather than elected position, so Andy Smith will continue in this role.

Treasurer's Report - Andy Smith reported that our year-to-date figures show that we spent \$79,484 more than we brought in. This was anticipated due to our second pastor, and will be addressed by a \$75,000 transfer from endowments.

Education - Andy A. reported that all is in the minutes.

Outreach - Julie noted that the commission will be meeting every other month. The members will take turns chairing the meetings.

Parish Life - There were enough people to sign up for the painting class, so it will be held in January. There is a possibility of a new photo directory in 2017.

Property - Herb said all their information is in the minutes.

Worship - Bernie reported on a February "Service of Loss". \$1,300 has been donated to the special flowers fund.

Stewardship - Andy noted that at the end of the fifth week of the stewardship campaign, we are ahead of last year's pledges by \$4,000, but with 25 fewer pledges. Average pledge is up by \$700, with 86 family groups pledging.

Andy also reported on the Apostles Academy of Arts and Sciences, noting it is now five years old, and that there are over 50 students. There are currently 4 scholarship students, two of whom provided music for the Blue Christmas Service.

Pastors Kuhn's Report

1. Pastor Kathy's 2017 housing allowance for tax purposes was approved for \$22,000 (Appel, Freeman).
2. The office will be closed on 12/26 and 12/27; also on 1/2/17.
3. The January meeting schedule is: MPC- Jan. 9; Commissions - week of Jan. 16; Council - Jan. 23; Spiritual Council - Jan. 30.
4. Regarding Gary's park plan, he brought it to the November 2016 Council meeting where we approved it going forward to a Congregational meeting. On Jan. 22, Gary will present the sermon along with Pastor Kathy. On Feb. 12, a Congregational meeting will be held. It is important that we tell congregants to become informed about the plan by attending meetings and asking questions.

Pastor Giffen's Report

1. Pastor Heather's 2017 housing allowance for tax purposes was approved for \$13,400 (Freeman, Forry).
2. From March 23 - April 16, Nina Hortig, a theology student from Germany, will be with us through a Penn Central Conference partnership program with the Evangelical Church of the Rhineland. We need to have host families willing to house her for a week, plus provide meals and transportation.




Summer Mission Trip to Honduras


Hershey Bears Faith and Family Night




**What's Happening in






