## Giving Report for December 2014

At the end of December 2014 our total operating revenues from all sources were \$482,110.36 of which \$394,148.34 were contributions to the general fund. Those numbers compare to last year at the end of December with \$489,811.54 of revenue with \$407,006.41 contributed to the general fund, a decline this year of \$7701.18 in revenue.

Operating expenses for the same time period were \$516,979.09 this year and \$493,143.95 last year. When you combine these numbers for the month of December and ultimately for the year of 2014, we will need to supplement our income with a transfer from investments of \$34,868.73.

Bernie Fickes reminded everyone to Come To The Stable.




Pastor Kuhn offered a Closing Prayer.

### The Jesus Fatwah: Love your (Muslim) Neighbor as Yourself

In Arabic, the word “fatwah” simply means “opinion”. In a religious context, a fatwah is a spiritually instructive opinion usually given as the answer to a question about religious law. Jesus was a master of the art of fatwah. Perhaps his most famous fatwah was his

commandment to “Love the Lord your God with all your heart... and your neighbor as yourself”. Have recent events made you wonder if this is possible?

Church of the Apostles is offering a 5 week study course about the Muslim faith. It will consist of DVD presentations by seventeen Islamic and Christian scholars offering reliable information about what Muslims believe, how they live out their faith, and how we all can be about building relationships across the lines of faith. Let's remember and treat our young men and women who are away at college, trade school, or serving in the military with a goody box for Valentine's Day. These young people will greatly



## Outreach

*Jesus said to Peter "Feed my lambs.... tend my sheep..... feed my sheep." -John 21:15-17*



Each January we collect our Mission to the Homeless special offering. In 2014, members of Church of the Apostles donated \$1,409.00 to this ministry and with an additional \$91.00 from our Outreach fund, the \$1,500.00 was divided between three non-profits. Two local non-profits, Transitional Living Center and the Lancaster County Council of Churches' Winter Overnight Shelter each received \$250.00. Bethany Homes in Womelsdorf, Pennsylvania received \$1000.00 for its Central American humanitarian ministry.

Through its four housing ministries, Veterans Victory House, Beth Shalom, Jubilee House, and Market View Apartments, TLC supplies transitional housing for veterans, women leaving prison, women leaving a treatment program, and permanent supportive housing for individuals and families with disabilities. All the transitional housing programs include mandatory education that focuses on the attainment of permanent housing.

The Lancaster County Council of Churches' Winter Overnight Shelter offers relief from the cold for homeless women and

children. Shelter is provided each night at the YWCA from December 1st to March 31st.

Thousands of Central American children have come to the United States looking for refuge and to be reunited with family. During the last 6 months of 2014, Bethany Homes has reunited 105 children with their families in the United States. The average stay at Bethany Homes is

brief, 8-12 days, and during that time each child is paired with a bilingual case manager who focuses on schooling, basic health issues, spiritual development, recreation, and most importantly

reunification with family. Our donation was earmarked for the 7 sets of clothing each child will receive before leaving Bethany Homes to begin this new chapter in their lives. Bethany will be continuing this ministry throughout 2015.

Please consider donating generously to this ministry so we can continue supporting nonprofits that address the needs of the less fortunate in 2015.

### Special Day to Help Others Apostles Assistance Fund- February 15th

On February 15th, you will have an opportunity to assist many individuals.
