The cash flow for eleven months ending November 30, 2017 was negative (\$158,626.21). Operating Expenses through November 2017 were \$544,219.22, Revenue was \$385,593.01. We began the year with \$1,947,407.85 in endowment funds and the end November balance was \$1,898,399.51. In December, COA received a \$120,000.00 legacy payment from the Carol Schneider estate.

Council Meeting Minutes — November 20, 2017

Devotions on being grateful was led by Linda Lewis.

Minutes in October were approved by Clara/Herb.

Treasurer's Report: Income from the investment fund has exceeded expectations this year. The church is required to take a portion of that income to use in the operating accounts.

Stewardship: Remaining envelope sets will be used to give special offering envelopes to electronic givers. Each Commission should look at the endowments and be sure to use the interest before the end of the year.

Education: There was a discussion on the use of Preschool classrooms by the Sunday School classes. Two of the rooms used have a connecting bathroom and are conveniently located and believed safe choices for the children. Sometimes items in the rooms are not returned exactly the way they were. Sunday School teachers need to double check to make sure items are back in the correct places at the end of class.

Outreach: The group voted on sending \$1000 for the Assistance fund, \$500 to LCCC and \$600 for Power Packs.

Parish Life: Food given by the different Commissions for the Annual Meeting was appreciated.

Called to Care needs more drivers.

The new kitchen policy will be evaluated by the Property Commission.

Final copies of the directories will be here the beginning of January.

Parents who have not sent in information on their child for the Crown should send it to the office.

Parish Life is looking for someone to help keep the kitchen clean and refrigerators organized. It pays \$30 a month.

Property: 95 lights in the Sanctuary were replaced. Marty Holmes found a farmer, Martin Miller, who is interested in planting soybeans in the Rader Park area that was formerly the site of the Seeds of Hope Garden. He will combine three garden plots, eliminating the grassy areas between those plots for a total space of about 2.1 acres. He will take care of all of the planting costs and will then give the church one-third of the net profits. Mr. Miller has already cut down the weeds in these three plots. The Commission members readily agreed to this proposal and thanked Marty and Herb for arranging this.

Worship: Decorating the church will be held on December 2 at 9 AM.

Pastor Heather's Report: There are two candidates with a good background for the nursery attendant who will be interviewed shortly.

Pastor Kathy's Report: There will be a paper in the bulletin describing the small groups that were proposed and a way to sign up.

She described a dream of Don Freeman that would have the seminary use COA as a campus for teaching. The students would practice skills at our church and be an intern chaplain at Homestead. An endowment for the seminary could support it. Pastor Kathy and David Longenecker, the chaplain at Homestead, will approach the seminary.

New Business: New council members will attend the

next meeting. New officers will need to be voted on- 3 of the 4 will be leaving. Housing allowances for the pastors will be voted on.

We need to look at what ministry can be done with the farmhouse.

Executive is working on personnel evaluations and setting agendas for Council.

The UCC Insurance Board should be looked at for all-inclusive insurance.

Next meeting: Each member should bring something for dinner on Dec. 18th. We will meet at the Youth Center at 6 PM. Andy Smith has the devotions for the meeting.

Annual Meeting Minutes—November 19, 2017

Invocation/prayer

Steve Daniels introduced the budget as balanced with revenues and disbursements. He talked about where the money goes and its impact on the community and world.

A vote was called on the budget by George Alspach and seconded by Herb Forry. The ballot also listed the new council members. We found out later that the budget passed with 117 votes. All the council members passed with 118 votes.

Cathy Kenlin summarized what the MPC (Ministry Planning Committee) does. Events are planned which encourage different Commissions to cooperate with each other, such as the Mission Fair. We need volunteers to carry on our work. Due to the time constraints that people have, consideration is taken to outline the amount of time and just what needs to be accomplished. The process for someone to carry out a project is streamlined so it can happen more easily. Volunteers are much appreciated.

Pastor Kuhn gave members a few questions about church that each table could discuss. She then discussed the need for church safety, holding spaces for all to be included and the need to put God's work before the status quo. She is planning to fast from November 27-30

with liquid and fruit and encourages anyone who would like to join her each evening from 6-7:00 at church. A number of focused small groups were presented and sign-up sheets were at the tables. There will be further information later with times to sign up for what might interest members.

Mission to the Homeless: January 21st

"Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me." This month, we will be collecting our annual Mission to the Homeless Special Offering. Over the years, this offering has helped support the efforts of local and national nonprofits who assist those who struggle with homelessness in one form or another. Locally, Claire House, Milagro House, Water Street Mission, and the Winter Overnight Shelter have previously been recipients of funds from this offering. Nationally, we have donated to the efforts to reunite Central American children with families already living in the United States.

This year, thanks to the generosity of the congregation in 2017, Outreach voted to support Transitional Living Center (TLC) with a \$1,000 donation and the UCC's Hurricane Disaster Relief efforts with a \$500 donation. Helping individuals, couples, and families develop self-sufficiency skills and attain housing stability, the Transitional Living Center is the only homeless shelter in Lancaster that allows families to remain together. TLC also has the Veteran's Victory House program that specifically focuses on the needs of veterans experiencing homelessness. Harvey, Irma, and Maria made a very compelling argument for donating to the UCC Hurricane Disaster Relief fund. In a little over a month, those three hurricanes caused extensive damage in parts of Texas and Florida, and devastated Puerto Rico. The UCC Disaster Relief efforts have been present from the beginnings and continue to help with recovery.


