Giving Report for November 2015

As we near the end of this year, it looks like we will do better financially than we originally expected. Our actual numbers of \$431,178.50 income and \$476,561.88 expenses leave us with a deficit of \$45,383.38 with only one more month left in the year. We usually have very healthy giving in December; and so the expectation is that our final deficit for the year will be less than \$40,000. That is significantly lower than our projections for 2015. For that we are grateful, while - at the same time - we mourn the fact that we are still in a deficit-giving pattern.

For comparison, in November of 2014, we had an income of \$435,018.01 and expenses of \$464,416.87; this amounted to a deficit of \$29,398.86.

The Stewardship Commission would like to extend the invitation to all church members to come and sit in on a Stewardship Commission



meeting, and also think about joining the Commission. We would be grateful for more feedback from the congregation on our financial leadership of the church.

At the Council meeting last evening (December 21st), the officers for the 2016 year were elected. There were no debates, no politics, and no controversy. It was refreshing! No matter whether we talk about our personal future, the future of our church, or the future of world, each of us has our personal thoughts, beliefs, and perspectives. No one should feel uncomfortable expressing such as discussion about our vision for Church of the Apostles begins.

Commissions will begin review and comments/ suggestions in upcoming meetings. Remember: *all* Commission meetings are open to any member of the church. If you have a favorite Commission, attend its meeting and participate! If that's not your excitement, talk with Council members (there will be a new contact list for 2016 available soon). If not them, talk with each other!

Changes? Maybe in some things, but not without the involvement of every member who wants to participate. The future of Church of the Apostles is bright; visions move from dreams to reality. We can *all* be part of that process; we *need* to be part of that process.

Stewardship Campaign 2016

Our Stewardship Campaign for 2016 has concluded, and the Stewardship Commission would like to thank everyone who committed to supporting Church of the Apostles for another year. Our promised donations for 2016 amount to \$258,785, which is an increase of \$23,454 or 10% over last year's campaign. Fifty-nine percent of the contributions needed in 2015 were covered by members' pledges, and next year we'll be able to cover 65% of our budgeted envelope contributions through pledges. This is extremely good news for all of us because it points to the increased willingness of the congregation to get involved with and commit to our church. Thank you all very much for providing us with this good news.

End of Fiscal Year 2015

Every year, the Stewardship Commission allows contributions to be accepted for a few days after the new year to accommodate those who like to consider their tax situation before making their final donations. If you would like to take advantage of this grace period and send a donation in January to be credited to your 2015 statement, please make sure your check is post-dated for 2015 and is in the office by the morning of January 5th.

Valentine Ministry



LCCC Food Hub/Clothing Bank/Wheels to Work

I am sure everyone has noticed that the grocery cart that had graced our Narthex for the last six months is no longer with us. The cart, which measured our 40th

Anniversary pledge of \$10,000 to the Lancaster County Council of Churches for its new 27,000 square-foot location on Queen Street, is gone because our goal has been reached and exceeded! A total of \$13,612.39 has been raised by contributions from baseball and restaurant fundraisers, Commissions and our youth, and donations — small and large — from church members. Our \$10,000 pledge will be applied to the 2.5 million dollar capital campaign goal with the remaining funds being directed to a \$300,000 fund that will address an unexpected and unfortunate roofing issue at the new location.





Much excitement has been generated due to the upcoming National Youth Event (NYE) being held at Disney World from July 26-30, 2016. Our youth and families are preparing for their spiritual and social justice learning adventure where more than 4,000 teens and chaperones will be gathering this summer. There are about 15 COA youth and/or families interested in attending.

This is a fantastic opportunity for our youth at a reasonable price of \$549 per person (double occupancy) or \$599 per person (single occupancy). Airfare will vary, but the approximate cost will be between \$250 - \$300.

Each month, the youth will be sponsoring several fundraisers to generate the money needed for lodging and transportation to and from Florida. Please watch for ways in which you can help them and their chaperones reach their goal. In addition, they will be available to volunteer for help in their neighborhoods and communities in the hopes of earning money. Proceeds from each event will be divided among those who were present. The youth will also be contributing "goodwill"

money toward this trip by the end of January.
