From the Pastor...

The time of my sabbatical is quickly approaching, so I want to reiterate my promise to return at the end and to continue pastoring at Church of the Apostles for at least one year past my return, barring any unforeseen illness or tragedy. I know that this congregation has been betrayed by pastors in the past, but I am not one of those. In fact, on July 1—my last Sunday prior to my sabbatical—I will enter into a covenant with the congregation and Rev. Giffen about each of our roles during this time. It is my hope that you will be present on that day to participate in the promises of the covenant and that we will all abide by them.

During my time away, I will be studying Christian community in other settings and noting what is working elsewhere and what might work best for us. At the same time, you will be using the phrases you shared on Palm Sunday as you also decide what is most important about Christian community in our setting using our particular set of passions and gifts. By focusing on the things we do best and which give us energy, we can powerfully share Christ's message of hope and love with others.

Rev. Giffen will continue to preach once a month, and another pastor who is coming on part-time to help her will preach once a month. Other weeks will be covered by our own members who have stories of their experience at COA to share, as well as hearing from some of our Penn Central Conference clergy staff. When I return, we will have a few forums to share what we have learned and our thoughts about the vision and mission to which God is calling us in this time and place.

I hope you will engage at the church during my absence and take this as an opportunity to hear the wisdom of others. May God bless each of us with a rich time of connecting with one another and Jesus the Christ!

A Message from the Council President

My Dear Church Family,

I want to take this mid-year point to thank EVERYONE who keeps our church moving along. It takes a dedicated staff and a lot of volunteers to accomplish our ministry here at COA. Take the time to read the Council minutes to see all that is being done here at COA.

There is one Outreach mission that needs attention ASAP before the summer heat comes. The Transitional Living Center, or TLC, is on East King St. and provides temporary housing and programs to veterans, individuals, and families. I have learned that during the summer months, the top floor is uninhabitable because of the excessive heat. That results in 20-25 people not being able to be helped. We have made an impact on many people in the past through our outreach, and I view this as another opportunity to continue helping people. I have confidence that we can raise the funds to get the necessary air conditioning installed that would result in more people being served. This project is not starting something new, but equipping a successful existing ministry so they do not have to turn people away, as in the past, because of lack of livable space.

Doug Hopwood from TLC will be addressing our

congregation on Sunday, June 18 to give more details. Google TLC in Lancaster, PA. for more about what they do.

I want to leave you with a thought: "Live and work in the Spirit and look for Holy encounters, for we could be the angels that bless others' lives".

Lancaster Theological Seminary

- Outreach Commission

By the time you read this article, Lancaster Theological Seminary will have graduated 27 men and women into four various groups of ministry. These include: 20 Master of Divinity degrees, five Doctor of Ministry degrees, one Master of Arts degree in religion, and one certificate in youth and young adult ministry. It will begin with a baccalaureate worship service at 8 am in Santee Chapel on campus. Commencement service will follow at 11 am at Church of the Apostles UCC.

All of this is past history, but it leads us into the purpose for this article.

Our church—and many others in the area—have been served by graduates of this Seminary. We would like to continue having this ministry to serve our congregation (in the future) as well as many other congregations through America.

In the words of the Seminary: Our vision—Where God transforms us to transform others and the world; Our Core Values—Honoring and Respecting Diversity in its many forms; Creating and Nurturing Community where we learn support and inspire each other; Upholding Academic Excellence at the core of our Educational Purpose; and Appreciating and Understanding the richness of multiple faith traditions.

Since 1825, Lancaster Theological Seminary has consistently and successfully responded to the changing needs of students and the wider church community. In doing so, it has earned a reputation for offering an education characterized by exceptional teaching, a strong focus on biblical theological reflection, and practical formation experiences that develop outstanding leaders.

Our congregation is invited to invest in the educational mission. So, we are urged to invest in a strong, more vital Seminary, invest in students through scholarships, and invest in facilities to preserve, enhance, and make fully accessible our historic campus.

Transitional Living Center

Transitional Living Center (TLC) is no stranger to Church of the Apostles. The second largest shelter in Lancaster County, this organization's goal is to end homelessness through its programs for veterans, individuals, couples, families (the only local shelter that offers a program for families to stay together), and those recently released from prison. All the TLC programs include mandatory education that focuses on the attainment of permanent housing. Over the years, our church has supported TLC with donations to cover general expenses and security deposits for those attaining permanent housing, hot bazaar soup, and supplies of personal items.

One of the messages we have been receiving from our pastors recently is to go out into the community and find what the needs are. Our Council President, Steve



Daniels did just that when he spoke with Division Manager Doug Hopwood of TLC and learned of a need for air conditioning in several rooms in the building. TLC has 52 rooms, six of which have no windows, requiring a special type of heating/A/C unit. In three of these rooms, the A/C unit is broken and is making them uninhabitable for the summer months. This is especially unlucky since TLC is experiencing record need for interim housing. Because these rooms are located on the highest floors in the building, it will be a herculean task (involving a crane!) to get the condensers and units installed. Doug is still gathering bids, but the cost could be as high as \$15,000.

After I met with Doug and toured TLC, the Outreach Commission discussed this project and voted to donate \$2,500 toward it, taking the funds from the Market Basket and Outreach accounts. Parish Life is also kindly making a \$600 donation. If you would like to support this mission personally, please make your check out to Church of the Apostles AND put in the memo area "TLC mission." By working together as a church, I think we have a great opportunity to help TLC reach its 100% capacity!
