
In February, Reverend Giffen and I had the opportunity to attend the Penn Central Conference Clergy Convocation and hear the Reverend Michael Piazza, a UCC minister from Atlanta, GA. Rev. Piazza has the distinction of being the founding pastor of the Cathedral of Hope in Dallas, TX and a co-founder of the Center for Progressive Renewal in Atlanta. With his move to Atlanta, he took the call to a small church which was literally falling down to see if what he teaches actually works in a small church. In his pastorate at the Virginia-Highlands Church, he has grown the congregation from 20 to 147 in average weekly attendance and has over 2,200 connected with the congregation.

In order to revitalize the “vintage” church he encouraged us to “reinvent yourself.” He explained the importance of having a good data system to know who is worshiping with us and notice when they are missing. We are challenged to make our liturgies, rituals, and music accessible to those who were not raised in the church, but are looking for ways to make meaning of their lives. This can be as simple as referring to the area of our fellowship time as the Narthex (lobby) with both terms and members using social media to “check-in” a word or picture of hope, love, or grace during worship.

Fortunately, our data system is the best according to him, but we need to make sure the data is accurate. To help us with this, we have added to it a mobile app for smart phones called “The City.” This is a private space where you will be able to login and share information, volunteer for events, update your information, and post notes for groups within the church. Look for more information from Michelle, our Communications Coordinator, as we “roll out” this new feature to help COA communicate more effectively.



## Giving Report for January 2016

Unfortunately, winter weather has more of an impact than you might think. We were poised to have a good start to our giving this year with higher pledges, but when the weather causes a cancellation in Sunday services we fall short in our collections. This year in January, we experienced a loss in income of \$10,650.35 compared to last January. This year was \$27,223.09 in revenue and last year was \$37,873.44.

On the other hand, we held down expenses this January by \$1,379.70. This year we spent \$39,401.66 in January compared to last January's \$40,781.36.

All together, we experienced a loss of \$12,178.57 for the first month of the year. Not the beginning we were hoping for, but not a tragedy either. Our members remain generous and some of that will come back to us as people make up the difference in their pledge.

## Outreach

### One Great Hour of Sharing

St. Paul preached that Christians should "rejoice with those who rejoice and weep with those who weep."

Again, we have the opportunity to contribute to the UCC One Great Hour of Sharing's (OGHS) mission to help those who very much need help worldwide. Over 46 million Americans live in poverty. Worldwide, 34 million children suffer from acute malnutrition. Nearly half of the world's population try to live on less than \$2 per day. The current refugee crisis is the worst since World War II. This year, 14% of the OGHS offering is dedicated to refugee concerns. Among other concerns are health, education, and agriculture (58%). Only 1% is used for administration.

The One Great Hour of Sharing offering is March 20.

### Wishing Well

Once again, you have been so very generous with your donations to Day of Smiles and to the Lancaster County Council of Churches. Thank you to all of you for so generously reaching out to others. We are going to continue to reach out to those in our community by collecting needed items for the Transitional Living Center (TLC) on King Street. TLC helps many homeless people

by providing safe and caring shelter to them until they are able to obtain housing of their own. We will be collecting needed supplies in the Wishing Well during the months of March and April. ### Mission Fest & Crispus Attucks Meal






### Book Club





An egg hunt will follow at 10:30 am in the Church Courtyard.


