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During recent Spiritual Council meetings, I have expressed interest in taking a Sabbatical. According to my contract, I am eligible for a Sabbatical after five years of continued ministry, and I am now in my ninth year as a pastor at Church of the Apostles, UCC. Much has happened during those years, and I now believe we are at a place where I can step aside for three months and you will be well served by Rev. Giffen and a supply pastor, to yet be named, to preach and help with pastoral care. I am also aware that previous pastors have taken advantage of the Sabbatical time as an indication of their departure. Let me be perfectly clear that this is NOT my intention. Rather, Sabbatical time for me will be one of rest, renewal, and learning.

So over the next 12 months, I hope to inform you about the significance of a Sabbatical for the clergy as well as other key staff and volunteers. Sabbaticals are based on the idea of Sabbath rooted in the Hebrew Scriptures. Genesis 2:1-3 notes that God rested from the work of creation after seven days. In the Ten Commandments, we are implored to "Remember the Sabbath" as a day of reflection on the blessings of God.

At this point, it is my plan to take a Sabbatical during July, August, and September of 2017 with the intent of rest, renewal, and discovery. I will be visiting places to learn about how other churches create and encourage community, and specifically intend to visit the Iona Abbey in Scotland, Countryside UCC in Omaha, NB and the Church of the Beatitudes in Phoenix, AZ as well as other churches as David and I drive cross-country. The Church of the Beatitudes is the one after which our campus structure was patterned.

I ask for your prayers as plans are created, that this may be a time of growth for both the congregation and me.

I've remarked several times in my meanderings how comfortable it is to be with my friends at COA. Whether I'm sharing some time with a more seasoned member or with one of our youth—and with those "tweens" (that's over 20 and, perhaps, under 60), the open and relaxed conversation makes my day. The trust that is shared in more serious matters is also gratifying, and the characteristics we share, as well as the fellowship, keep me anticipating my return to my community. Remember, I'm writing this from a distance, and a foreign (although friendly) country...

I'll be happy to be back.

Giving Report for August 2016

At the end of the eighth month this year, after we adjust for the timing of moving our interest income to our checking account, our envelope and direct deposit giving almost match what they were last year. Our total income for 2016 has increased about \$7,000 in the area of rentals, so that is a good trend to have. Our actual numbers reflect an additional \$32,000 moved into our checking account this year that had not yet happened last year. This year, our total income showed \$347,532 as opposed to the income last year of \$308,271.

When we look at the expense side of our income statement, we can better see the whole picture. Our expenses for this year total \$386,260 compared to last year's \$344,126. All of these numbers complete the picture that shows a total loss so far in 2016 of \$38,728.



Outreach

End of the Season

Yes, the 2016 gardening season is over. There are clean-up duties to attend to and planning to be done for next season, but the planting, weeding, and harvesting have come to an end.

It wasn't a great year for growing things. The weather was uncooperative more than half of the time and the garden workers are a year older than last year, so it felt like it was harder to do everything. The real winners were the bugs! They should be pretty pleased with themselves. They were so successful, that we won't be growing potatoes anymore. We don't have the manpower, the stamina, the money, or the chemicals to make that a success.

But we will return in the spring, rested and ready to go all over again. Thank you for your support this season that made it possible for hungry people in East Hempfield Township to have more to eat. It was a privilege to grow food for them again.

Special Mission Offering — October 2

Neighbors in Need (NIN) is a special mission offering of the UCC that supports ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. One-third of NIN funds support the Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). Two-thirds of the offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries (JWM) to support a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects through grants. NIN grants are awarded to churches and organizations doing justice work in their communities. Funding for these grants is through donations to the Neighbors in Need offering, which will be received on October 2, 2016 by most UCC congregations as part of their World Communion Sunday observance. The 2016 theme for NIN is "This We Believe" and connects the issue of child hunger to the work that the UCC congregations are doing to serve their communities and address this injustice. An excellent example of how COA is supporting the cause is through Outreach to the Power-Packs Project, support of the food bank through monetary, food, and produce donations through our Seeds of Hope Garden! Services (CWS) continues to change lives through



Property Commission Update

The Property Commission

Good News! Construction in Rader Park restarted on September 6th. After a long and challenging journey, the Property Commission, Homestead Village, and East Hempfield Township reached an agreement on a redesigned storm water management plan that we can all live with. Signatures were put in place during the week of August 29th, and dirt started moving on September 6th. The revised plan will provide the following:

- The large detention basin will have a level floor that is dry and can be routinely mowed.
- The discharge area south of the detention basin will consist of strategically placed stones to minimize the velocity of the discharged water and promote infiltration back into the land rather than free flowing into Brubaker Run.
- Plants will be installed in the discharge area again to help retain as much water on site as possible.
- An underground pipe will be connected to a pipe that currently supplies water to our pond. This connection will divert water to our pond rather than Brubaker Run.
- A "spring box" and pump will be installed to capture the water from a spring that was disturbed during the earlier construction. The discharge from this new

pump will be directed to our pond.

- A short wall of boulders will be installed between the detention basin and the gravel lane by the shed. This will allow the edge of the detention basin to be moved farther away from our gravel lane. Bollards (safety posts) will be installed to provide an added layer of safety for vehicles.
- 43 new trees will be planted in Rader Park to replace the trees damaged or removed during the construction.
- The dirt pile will be cleaned up and made smaller with a cover crop of grass that can be mowed.

Thanks to Homestead Village for leaving Rader Park better than when they started construction a year ago.

Apostles Community Preschool

On Wednesday, September 14th, the halls of Church of Apostles were once again filled with happy voices as Apostles Community Preschool began its **fifty-first** year! For this school year, 2016-17, we have 160 children in 12 classes, with 18 staff members.

As a reminder, the front parking lot of the church is very congested daily from 8:50 am – 9:10 am, as Preschool parents use our car drop-off line. Please use extreme caution when entering the parking lot during that time. It may be best to use the choir or the gym lot if you have church business during that time. Also, please remember that all the church doors, with the exception of the main front entrance, are locked from 9:00 am - 12:30 pm (until 2:00 pm on Wednesdays) for safety reasons while the preschoolers are in the building. If you need to enter the building for any reason, and you have a key to open one of the locked doors, please be sure to re-lock it. The safety of the children in our care is of extreme importance.
