

Treasurer's Report: No meeting of Stewardship this month. Andy was pleased at the reception and unanimous approval of the 2019 Budget by the Congregation.

Commission Reports:

Education – in packet Outreach – in packet Parish Life - in packet

Property – in addition to report, there is a meeting scheduled with John Tesch, Homestead Village Property Manager, to discuss details about the Barn project. Herb hopes to talk with him about their interest in the Farmhouse, and the opportunities for collaboration in the project for Rader Park being developed with the Green Team and the Chesapeake Bay Foundation. There was discussion of new security measures to lock outside door by the Choir Room once worship services begin, and reopen at the close of worship.

Stewardship - asks that counting attendance in each service be on the Head Usher list.

Worship – appreciate any help with decorations on Friday November 30 and Saturday, December 1, 2018. The Outdoor Nativity is of particular concern.

Old Business:

Council Meeting Minutes Continued

Designated Interim: Executive Committee recommends hire of Dan Dorsey for an additional 10 hours beyond his internship hours. This would be a contracted hourly position, not affecting his internship stipend. He will be gone for 3 weeks in May for the required cross-cultural training with LTS. By August he will begin an internship in another situation as a part of his ongoing program at LTS. His contract as a temporary employee would be from December, 2018 to July 31 of 2019. Motion approved by an unanimous vote.

Farmhouse: Homestead has not responded to Herb's letter asking for more information about their interest in a lease agreement. It was suggested that a congregational forum be put together so that members could explore their feelings about usage of the building.

Christa asked if the Search Committee should include the Farmhouse as a potential parsonage in the Church Profile. Herb moved that the Farmhouse be excluded from the Profile except as a physical asset. The motion passed with 3 abstentions from members of the Search Committee.

Reflections on Congregational Meeting: Members reported a sense of positive energy. Discussion starters were helpful and elicited good exchanges. There was a sense that people were pleased to share their thoughts with each other and that new friendships were developing. There were some slips returned, expressing interest in joining particular ministries.

New Business:

Personnel changes: The Executive Committee continues with interviews. They have explored the potential of redefining Michelle's job to focus on the office secretarial responsibilities. Jonathan has expressed interest in taking over the social media piece, and upgrading the website with some new coding as well as keeping it current with information.

C.A.R.E.: Andy shared a fund-raising piece developed for C.A.R.E. He asked Council if he could present the appeal to the Congregation during worship, and pass out the appeal to interested members at the close of service. Discussion revealed that Council saw this as continuing an outreach ministry to the village in Honduras where we have already built a school carrying our name, where we have sent members of the church to participate in the medical ministries, to which we continue to send clothing,

empty medicine bottles, and for whom the Youth are raising money for a container ship load of food. Motion was passed.

January Council Retreat: Linda asked if there was interest in a retreat devoting a Saturday morning to interacting together, using the materials from the PAM video series on covenantal relationships among Church members and between the Congregation and Pastor. It would be an opportunity to review where to find things in the Council notebooks, ask Jack Oliphant to review Communion responsibilities, and begin to bond with new Council members. There was general interest in finding a date and developing such a retreat.


