Giving Report for May 2019

The cash flow for month ending April 30, 2019 was negative (\$34,189.29) for the year 2019 to that date. Same time last year was positive \$15341.70. Operating Expenses through April 2019 were \$182,871.80, Revenue \$148,682.51. Same time last year \$172,,683.86 for Expenses, \$188,025.65 for Revenue. We began 2019 with \$1,735,052.61 in endowment funds and the end April balance was \$1,811,451.26.

Endowment Funds Status: Merrill Lynch 1/1/17 - \$1,947,407.85. 1/1/18 - \$2,007,454.38 1/1/19 \$1,735,053.61. 3/31/19 \$1,779,542.50. Merrill Lynch has provided portfolio review documents regarding the Special Endowment and General Endowment Funds.



CHURCH OF THE APOSTLES COUNCIL MINUTES April 15, 2019

Call to Order: 7:07 pm by Christa Conrad, President **Devotions:** Betsy Bischoff led using I Corinthians 12, emphasizing differing spiritual gifts are to be used for "the common good".

Minutes: on motion of John Eshbach, seconded by *Todd Harris*, the minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report: omitted in absence of treasurer. **Commission Reports:**

MPC: Meeting just completed before Council meeting. Next meetings in June and September.

Education: As in packet. Plans for joint VBS with Salem UCC, Wacky Wednesday, are gelling. **Stewardship:** As in packet. Working on finalizing

Reed bequest.

Outreach: As in packet.

Parish Life: As in packet. Reminder of joint projects: Garage Sale needs all hands on deck the week after Easter to prepare for the garage sale on Friday April 26 and Saturday, April 27. Blessing Bags will be done by Education, Outreach and Parish Life from May19 through August 18. These bags will be donated to the Prison's Reentry program: Resources, Mentoring, and Opportunities or RMO. The Fall BB focus will be on hygiene items. Interest in a day trip to DC to visit the African American Museum is being explored. Life Touch is willing to do a new photo shoot when there are 15 - 20 people interested.

Worship: As in packet. Question was raised about the state of the **red pew pads** and potential replacement. What purpose do they actually serve? Who tallys the data, and who uses it? Original purpose was to identify guests. Ushers do a head count. There does not seem to be a need to record individual attendance. Guests could/should/are asked to sign the guest book in the lobby by the Sunday greeters. Need for more outgoing contact by greeters, even if discovering that the person greeted has a longstanding relationship with Church of Apostles.

Property: Herb Forry shared his concern that after he reported to Council last month that tree planting on April 13 had been postponed, there were some 100 trees planted in Rader Park on the 13th by Chesapeake Alliance, Scouts, and Green Team members. Heat Pumps in Sanctuary need to be replaced. Property is expecting bids, but anticipates costs to be about \$40,000. to replace and install both. On motion of John Eshbach, and second by Marty Holmes, Council voted unanimously to approve a request to schedule a Special Congregational Meeting to approve the expenditure. The date will be set with consideration of the need for bulletin announcements, and letter to Congregation ten days before meeting. Sanctuary Light Replacement is delayed because the company that was to supply the lights themselves has gone bankrupt. The installer is researching other companies and will rebid. Hopefully the cost will remain as projected. Garden Plots have been advertised to church members and Homestead residents. There are plots remaining. Marty Holmes agreed that they could be advertised online on our media outlets. Kathy will ask Mary Tunison, Communications Coordinator to do that immediately after Easter. Cupholders for Sanctuary, had been recommended to Property as way to avoid spilages on carpet. Property asked Worship Commission to advise them before going forward. General discussion led to the suggestion that gentle reminders, but word of mouth, and a sign or two reminding people to assure that a container of liquid being taken into the Sanctuary have a secure lid.

Pastor's Report: Packet contains reports from both Kathy and Dan. Kathy asked how Council members felt about their contacts with congregation members. It was decided the group needs another month to complete. **Growth Task Force** is in process of reaching out to new residents within a 3 mile radius of the Church. They have established a "greeting team" who contact the new resident with a personal note and a flyer about Church of Apostles. The note invites the new resident to give the greeter a call so they can be met at Church by a familiar person.

Old Business: Kathy asked Council's opinion about pursuing conversations with New Beginning Evangelical Church regarding sharing our building with them. She has been reading an article "How to Share your Building", and found it helpful to acknowledge what issues might arise. Council members suggested, New Beginnings Church be asked about their plans for Church School, or

child care during their services. Will they want access to kitchen? Could their use of rooms, other than the Sanctuary, be subject to the same conditions we have for anyone else requesting space? All present encouraged Kathy to continue conversations. Before a contract is presented, the conditions will be shared with the congregation, and the congregation must agree to share our building with New Beginnings.

New Business: Christa informed Council, but asked for confidentiality from Council Members about a meeting of Worship Commission, Choir Members, and Executive Council exploring shifts in the leadership of Music Ministry. Cindy Kahler desires to retire as Director of Music Ministry at end of June, and assume a smaller role. She is considering an offer from Executive Council as Interim DMM with reduced responsibilities until a revision of the Job Description, and a rebalancing of expectations and duties is completed, and a search undertaken for leadership of our Music Ministry. Those meetings are scheduled on May 2, and May 5 at normal choir rehearsal times.

Closing Prayer: offered by Pastor Kuhn. **Meeting Adjourned:** 8:58 pm **Next Meeting:** May 20, 2019 at 7 pm in the Parlor

THE LANCASTER THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY

The Lancaster Theological Seminary [LTS] is one of seven seminaries of the UCC. At 555 West James Street, its campus is across College Avenue from F&M and has 10 buildings, from library to chapel to classrooms to student apartments. Before moving to its current location, the Seminary, founded in 1825 was on the Dickinson College campus [with 5 students]. It moved to York in 1829 with 25 students. After moving to Marshall College in Mercersburg in 1836, the next site was at F&M in 1871. The present site was purchased in 1893 with buildings added beginning in 1894.

Currently, LTS offer the following degrees: Master of Divinity, Master of Arts in Ministry and Leadership, Doctor of Divinity and Certificate in Theological Studies. The Seminary is fully accredited. There are 7 core faculty and 33 adjunct. Student to teacher ratio is 16:1. This year 117 students attend, representing 24 denominations. 19% of the student body is LGBTQ. 82% of students receive some form of student financial aid. Ages of the students: 29% under 40; 28% are 41-50; 27% are 51-59 and 16% are over 60. The student body comes from 13 states and 2 foreign countries.

Current costs to attend LTS depend on degree intent, hours of classroom and campus costs. Current tuition for the 3 year [full time] program for the Master of Divinity degree is \$17, 750.00. The weekend program for the M.Div, 4 years, has a tuition of \$13,313.00 [per the student handbook]. Non-degree courses are offered at \$690.00 per credit hour. There are varying fees and costs depending on course load. For students living on campus, unfurnished apartments are available. Currently, a one bedroom apartment monthly rent is \$700.00/month, with a three year rent guarantee.

The vision statement of the Seminary is:

Create a place where God transforms us to transform others and the world.

Church of the Apostles is blessed to have the benefit of the Seminary so close to our campus. Our support is important and significant.
