From the Pastor...



would like to invite you to imagine a scenario with me. You come to church on Sunday morning and open the front door, mingle a bit in the Narthex and head to the Sanctuary. To your right is a table with the bulletins, you pick one up and head to your favorite pew (because we all have one, right??) Service starts, the pastor lights the candles on the altar and leads you through worship with only the piano music throughout. After the service, the pastor extinguishes the candles and exists the sanctuary. You follow and drop your offering in the basket on the way out. In the Narthex, you find the fellowship table empty and most people have headed out the door, so you follow suit. The next time the church crosses your mind is the following Sunday when it's time to get ready. Now, imagine that the previous Sunday was your first time visiting that church. Although, the message the pastor gave was good...do you return?

What was missing? How warm was the greeting as you entered the church, got your bulletin and headed to the pew? Do you bother to give when there is no usher to collect and singers during the offertory anthem? Who carried the light into the world if there is no acolyte? How do you fellowship with no food? (I'm Italian - there always needs to be food!!)

All of these things are handled by volunteers, but is that really the correct word to use? I had read an article a few Blessings, years ago stressing the need to use different terminology. The author likened church volunteers to a father babysitting his kids while the mother is out. "We do not

babysit that which is ours." Same is true in the church, we do not volunteer, for we are the church. We SERVE as greeter, we SERVE as fellowship hosts, ushers, choir members, we SERVE on committees, and make the church look and behave its best. Just like we do for children. We want it to be at its best when someone new comes around!! Whatever the job, we SERVE. It is a ministry. We are not an outside source volunteering at a business for a short time. We are investing in the church.

There are so many facets to running a church, and running it well. There is very little paid staff to accomplish all that needs to be done. So that is where we come in, as members. We have a tremendous congregation that steps up to the call to serve the church. But we need to recognize that burnout can happen when a select few take on too much. I have witnessed numerous times within the past year, members that have said "I need to step down, this is too much," but they cannot, because they are concerned that no one will step up and take their place. How can we honor the contributions they have made if we do not recognize that they need a break?

"We do not babysit that which is ours," so we need to all work together. We all need to set our personal boundaries and adhere to them. If we share the load, we will continue to be the inviting, well-mannered church that the community knows we are; and we WILL have food!!

6/11/2019 report for 5/31/19 comparative Income/Budget statement shows year to date negative (\$51,866.67). Year to date Operating Expenses to 5/31/19 were \$234,474.61, Revenue \$182,607.94. It was observed that last year COA had a \$25,000 initial special gift. Also, pension and insurance bills are now received monthly instead of quarterly.

Endowment Funds Status: Merrill Lynch 1/1/17 - \$1,947,407.85. 1/1/18 - \$2,007,454.38 1/1/19 \$1,735,053.61. 5-31-19 \$1,759,248.74. Market losses for May were (\$54,415.47).

Call to Order: 7:05pm by Christa Conrad, President Devotions: John Eshbach began by sharing pictures and history of the original St. John's German Reformed Church. He led in prayer.

Minutes: Council unanimously agreed to accept minutes. Treasurer's Report: see page 10 of packet.

Commission Reports:

MPC: Each Commission has submitted Annual Reports for 2018, rosters and goals for 2019. Next meeting June 17. **Education**. Requests a second person be hired as **Nursery** Attendant during Church Services. The Executive Committee has agreed to use monies in "Transforming Lives" budget to Kathy was encouraged to explore when/how we could hire her cover cost until new budgets are drafted.

Stewardship: As in packet.

Outreach: As in packet.

Parish Life: As in packet. Reminder to Commissions that Clara Kosmela, chair, has requested ideas for use of proceeds from recent Garage Sale.

Worship: As in packet. Commission asks who uses information gathered on the red pew pads before they simply replace because "we've always had them". There was general agreement that there should be a reason for asking people to "sign in". Discussion led to possible additional uses: knowing who is in the building, identifying people who may need a personal contact. Could this be done in another way? Betsy moved and John seconded : that Council ask MPC to form an Ad Hoc Committee to explore the use of an easily accessible, and user friendly, computer technology which might serve a variety of purposes. Motion Passed. All were in agreement that use should include a "human touch" MPC should suggest to Committee that they explore the computer program currently in use for member information as well as a program called: "My Attendance Tracker"

Property: Thanks to the Congregation for approving 86 to 0, the resolution to move ahead with replacement of AC Units in the Sanctuary. Apostles Preschool Board donated \$5,000 toward the project. Another \$ 7,000 is expected from two other donations. Stepping Stones were placed into Brubaker Run on Friday by Eric McLauren and Chuck Erisman. The stones will hold the bank, and make access for stream study safer. Sanctuary Lighting Project is out on bid to two other contractors. Cost is expected to be about \$90,000. Respectfully Submitted, liaht further. Purchase of Compact Tractor is under study. The current Barbara S. Achtermann, Secretary

equipment is limited in capacity, and becoming aged. New Electric Supplier: contract will be for 3 years at 0.477 kwh. Capital Campaign Committee: Tom Weaver and Herb Forry will represent the Property Commission on this committee forming to plan for the updating of Sanctuary, and building in advance of our upcoming 50th Anniversary (2021).

Pastor's Report: As in Packet. Kathy expressed gratitude for some time off in the midst of a very busy month. Kathy circulated the response to our questions regarding the request from New Beginnings Evangelical Church to share space at Church of Apostles. Council members noted a variety of conflicts with current uses of the building. While wanting to be encouraging to the New Beginnings Evangelical Church, the general consensus was that we should not continue to consider sharing the building with them. Several members had suggestions of spaces NBEC might explore which Kathy will share with their Pastor. Communications Coordinator: Kathy met with Mary Tunison this week, to share our appreciation of her work here. Mary expresses her sense that this is a great place to work. She is still under contract to the temporary agency. directly, and whether that could be done at a cost comparable to what we are paying agency.

Old Business: Lids are now available at the coffee table in lobby, and people seem to be using them. A retirement party will be held June 9 between services for Cindy Kahler, who goes on vacation after that. She will return in July as a parttime interim organist, and accompanist. The Executive Committee met with Nate Sheffer vesterday regarding his return from Medical Leave at the end of June. Communications Coordinator now has her own email: maryt@apostlesucc.org. Student intern's email is: jparedes@lancasterseminary.edu. New Business: Jan Reed estate settlement: Papers need to be signed and notarized on behalf of the church to transfer funds. A quorum of the Council is needed to approve receipt, and direct the President and Vice President to sign the papers. Members present suggest email be sent to all Council members stressing the importance of their attendance at a special meeting for purposes of approving action on this matter. Nominating Committee: To be put together now to prepare slate prior to Annual Meeting in November. Donna Carr, VP acknowledges that it is her role to form that Committee. "Food for Thought": Penn Central Conference has prepared a video from which we will challenge our collective thought between meetings. This month we are each asked to "imagine you are a visitor to your Church, how do you find out where you are going; where is the Parlor, the Restrooms? Do you feel comfortable? Will you return?

Where Does it All Go?

Two members of the Green Team visited LCSWMA recently. What is that? It is the Lancaster County Solid Waste Management Authority.

1954 was the year Lancaster and the surrounding towns realized that coming together to solve a waste problem was the best way to move forward. Now, they manage over 1 million tons of solid waste each year from Lancaster and Dauphin Counties. This is not the group that picks up your garbage, but it is where your company takes it.

We visited the Lancaster Waste-to-Energy, WTE, facility where waste is transformed into renewable energy. The process decreases the amount of trash going into the landfill by 90 %. The neutralized ash is then taken to the landfill.

LCSWMA offers free tours to 4 facilities. The WTE tour lasts 60 minutes and children must be at least 10 years old. Times given for tours are listed on the LCSWMA.org web site under educational resources. It is a very interesting field trip.


