Letter from the President

What Really Matters

n the last 8 months that I have been Council President, I've talked a lot about change. The change in seasons, the changes in our congregation, and in our leadership. Change is really the only constant we have. I don't mind change...I embrace it. I don't like for things to be monotonous or to get stale. That is to say, except for my pew in the sanctuary....that will never change! For some though, change is scary. As a congregation, we tend to be pretty rigid in our rituals, especially during services.

When Finn was younger and started to go up to the children's time with Pastor Kathy, he would bow down with his head on the floor when it was time to pray. I asked her if that was in any way disrespectful....for it is not the way I pray. Pastor Kathy's response. . . "Of course not, He's praying!" To this day, it is still the way he feels most comfortable having a conversation with God.

It got me thinking....what does prayer look like? In our congregation it is quiet and reserved. Heads bowed and eyes closed. Many find it uncomfortable to lift their hands or shout Amen! But...what does prayer look like? There are so many forms of prayer throughout the world. A quick google search will give you a multitude of different ways to pray. But are we wrong to stifle the spirit in someone else because that is not the way we would pray? We have received the greatest blessing in forgiveness from God, should we not be joyful, appreciative...or more importantly, authentic in showing our gratitude? We need to be authentic to ourselves in our conversations with God.



Paul, locked up in Rome for his faith in Jesus, wrote to the people of Philippi. As a chained prisoner, he shared, "I am thankful for all of you every time I pray, and it's always a prayer full of joy." *Philippians 1:4*

Go forth with a joyful prayer. Bow your head, raise your hands, or shout your joy! For what really matters is not what your prayer looks like....but only that you are praying!

Operating Expenses through July 2019 were \$338,043.95, Revenue \$274,452.09. Same time last year \$310,375.55 for Expenses, \$280,129.63 for Revenue.

Church Business Updates

CONGREGATIONAL MEETING & VOTING OF PROPERTY PROJECTS — AUGUST 11, 2019



Meeting called to order by Christa Conrad at 10:17 am. Usher count affirmed a quorum present. Ballots distributed.

Herb Forry, Chairman of the Property Committee, presented the ballot proposals: 1) to accept the sanctuary lighting project at

a cost of \$105,000., and 2) to accept the purchase of a compact John Deere tractor at a cost of \$23,000, of which \$9,500 is assured by donations.

While votes were being counted, Andy Appel, Chaiman of the Search Committee, reported that the committee had reviewed 10 applicants available now, and has elected to continue to review applicants. Meanwhile, Dan Dorsey has been asked to resume his role as interim Associate Pastor while he completes his final year at LTS. Dan, and Seminary Intern, Jon Paredes, will work to support Pastor Kuhn during the ongoing search for a fulltime Associate Pastor.

The vote count was returned and both projects were approved. Meeting adjourned at 10:50 am.

BACK TO SCHOOL AT APOSTLES COMMUNITY PRESCHOOL

Monday, September 11th, the halls of Church of the Apostles will be filled with happy voices, as Apostles Community Preschool begins its 54th year!

It was in September of 1965 that St. John's Community Preschool opened on Wheatland Avenue with one class

of eleven students and two teachers. Today's enrollment totals 160 children in 11 classes with 19 staff members.

The original purpose of the preschool, as stated in 1965, is as follows: "Apostles Community Preschool is conducted by the Church of the Apostles as an expression of its concern for assisting parents in the rearing of young children. The Preschool exists (a) to help each child grow and develop in trustful and loving relationships; and (b) to provide group learning experiences for preschool children through play, stories, conversation, music, movement, and art." Fifty-four years later, we are proud to be continuing this vision.

For the 2019-20 school year, Apostles Community Preschool offers one 5-day morning class, one 4-day morning class, three 3-day morning classes, one 2-day extended day class, two 2-day morning classes, and three 2-day Tot classes.

Janet Rader Memorial Scholarships provide financial assistance to children who may otherwise be unable to attend preschool; over \$22,000 has been awarded over the past decade. In the last school year, scholarships amounted to \$2,000. We welcome donations or memorial gifts to the scholarship fund at any time.

Kathryn Zellers is the Preschool Director; Linda Lewis serves as Registrar; Pam Smith serves as Treasurer.

The Preschool, which serves as an outreach of the educational ministries of Church of the Apostles to the community, operates as a separate entity reporting through the Education Commission to the Church Council.

Each year the adult choirs hope to welcome new members into their musical family. This year two dates have been set aside for anyone interested to come out and enjoy an evening of music making.




We would love to have members reach out to Nathan Sheffer so you can attend rehearsal on Thursday September 26 or October 17, 7 pm - 8 pm.
