As we are a United Church of Christ congregation, it seems appropriate that we remind ourselves now and then what that means. This worship season is about doing just that. In conjunction with a study of the book "What Matter to You Matters to Us," by Sidney Fowler, we are looking at the six vital themes of the United Church of Christ and a few other pieces that are helpful to know.

Our denomination is frequently misunderstood because of its covenantal, flat polity. As God has always promised to be our God and we are God's people, we as a congregation of the United Church of Christ covenant to be united with all other United Church of Christ congregations and therefore affected either positively or negatively by that relationship. We are also in relationship with the national office who speaks **to** us and not **for** us. We are a people who are united by our desire to name Jesus Christ as the sole head of the church. In a sermon recently, I also talked about the importance of St. Augustine's wisdom of: "In essentials, unity. In nonessentials, liberty. In all things, charity." In this wisdom, lies our polity.

One of the symbols for our denomination is the comma. The comma reminds us that we are people who believe that God is still speaking. We also call this "continuing testament" as we believe God continued to speak to God's people after the books of the Bible were written. The challenge is to discern what messages are truly from Christ. For me, Christ will always say things that promote hope, peace, love and joy. So anything that creates insiders and outsiders or is meant to hurt others is not from God.

I hope you will join the conversations in person or by watching the videos online.

Letter from the President

Whoever you are and wherever you are on life's journey, all are welcome here.

We don't specify that the journey has to look like ours, or that you can't talk about your journey. We don't tell you to sit in the back. We say ALL are welcome here. You are welcome to sit where you please (I'll even let you sit in my pew with me!!) We don't distinguish your ability to worship with us. ALL are welcome here.

I want to share the message I gave to the kids a few weeks ago, as I have been asked a few times: Pastor Kathy asked that I talk to the kiddos today about a conversation I had with my son, Finn, this past week regarding transgender. I'd like to do that but only with the permission of the parents here, because I know that this subject may be something that you want to talk about in your own way. I'm not here to take that away from anyone, and I would like to offer the opportunity for any parent that may see fit to leave for the Sunday School rooms, to do so. By getting up now, this does not indicate to the rest of us of your stance on the matter, just simply that you would like to be the one to deliver the conversation.

For all those parents left, hopefully my message today will help foster the verbiage in which you can continue this conversation at home.

Addressing the kids:

Most of you know me by now, as either Miss Christa or Finn's mom. Finn and I had a talk earlier this week because I knew he was going to be away today honoring the firefighters at the 9/11 stair climb with his dad and would not be here to hear our talk together.

I want to talk to you today about boys and girls....we all know some boys and some girls right? I'm a girl, and when I was growing up, my mom would pick out pretty dresses for me to wear and I would love to twirl around in them. They made me feel pretty and I liked wearing them. When I buy clothes for Finn, I buy him pants that he likes and t shirts with trucks and cars on them, because that's what he likes. Can you think of something that your mom or dad gives you to wear that you really like?

Well for some people, when they are growing up, when their parents put their clothes out everyday...what we normally think of as boy clothes or girl clothes....sometimes those clothes don't make them feel like they are in the right clothes. Some boys don't feel like they are boys at all on the inside, and some girls don't feel like they are girls at all on the inside.

Do you all remember when Mr. Dan was with us earlier this year? Well, Mr. Dan happens to be a boy that doesn't feel on the inside like he is a boy at all. It has taken Mr. Dan a lot of courage to stand up to everyone he knows in his life and say...even though I look like a boy...I feel like a girl. And for me to be happy, I want to dress like a girl and have a girl name. This is Miss Stephanie, she is the same wonderful person we knew as Mr. Dan, only now she is being who she really is. This is what make her happy on the inside.

I asked Finn, when we were talking, if he would want me to put out dresses and pink clothes for him to wear everyday, even though I know he likes pants and his favorite color to wear is blue. He said that wouldn't make him feel very good! Well, Miss Stephanie had to dress like a boy, and

The cash flow for month ending August 31, 2019 was negative (\$91,219.78) for the year 2019 to that date. Same time last year was negative (\$50,934.95). Operating Expenses through August 2019 were \$394,386.21, Revenue \$303,166.43. Same time last year \$385,994.15 for Expenses, \$335,059.20 for Revenue.

Some change hits us harder than others and it takes a minute to catch up. Some change we see coming and therefore can plan appropriately to avoid any stumbling. There is some truth to the quote regarding change, but we know it is not the only constant we have in this life, because we know God. God is constant, through all the changes we endure in life, his love is unwavering, his forgiveness unending.

We have had some heavy conversations around my house in the past month, and a few at church as well. Allowing Finn to walk with us in a very real way has taught some valuable lessons and the compassions he is showing lets me know that I have made the right decision in calling Church of the Apostles home. ■

Each year the adult choirs hope to welcome new members into their musical family. This year two dates have been set aside for anyone interested to come out and enjoy an evening of music making.

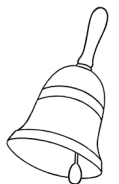
We would love to have members reach out to Nathan Sheffer so you can attend rehearsal on October 17, 7 pm – 8 pm.

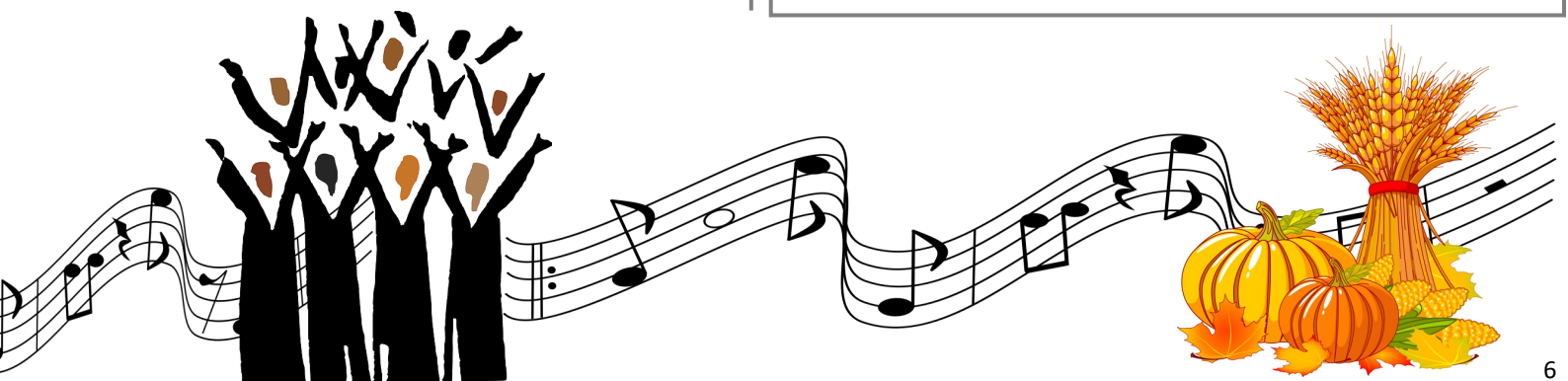


APOSTLE BELLS

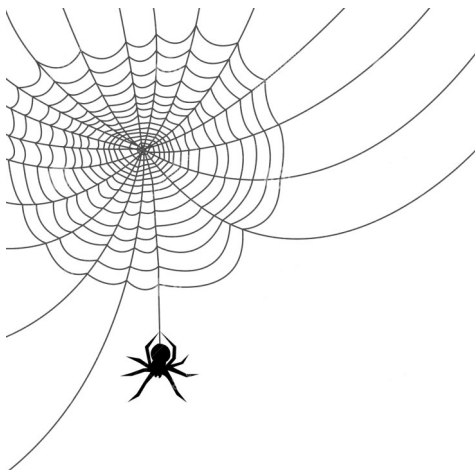

PASTORAL LEADERSHIP FOR THE 2019-2020 SCHOOL YEAR

Stephanie Dorsey — Will continue as the contracted part-time Interim Associate Pastor during her last year in seminary for 15 hours per week.

Jonathan Paredes — Will serve as our Seminary Intern for 6-8 hours per week and give us an additional 5 hours.

Cathy Kenlin — is a seminary-trained gifted writer within our congregation who has also agreed to help.

With the objective to empower this team to work out of their strengths, their roles and responsibilities are outlined below:

Stephanie — Worship leadership liturgy writing for the 10:45 AM service, preaching every 4-6 weeks, adult education classes, leading member and hospital visitations and assisting with confirmation

Jonathan — Worship leadership with some writing for the 9:15 AM service, preaching monthly, assisting with weddings & funerals, member and hospital visitations, youth group leadership and fellowship opportunities

Cathy — Writing weekly devotionals and liturgy for 9:15 AM service, adult education classes on spiritual practices and prayer

Pastor Kuhn — Oversight and mentoring of all the listed assignments, Worship design and preaching 2 to 3 times per month; supporting leadership of children's educational programming; confirmation and youth group; visitation in critical situations; collaborating with the leadership of standing commissions, Council and its subcommittees, Executive Committee, Growth Task Force, Ministry Planning, Spiritual Council, Music Ministry; maintaining connections with Conference, Ministerium, LTS, Community Service Organizations; and supporting office staff and property manager.

Although this is not the arrangement we expected, our leadership feels that it will be the best arrangement for this year. The Search Committee will resume reading profiles in 2020 to find a full-time associate. We hope that you will also be an active supporting presence in the ministries of our congregation as we seek to grow and more fully become the church God is calling us to be.
