hen I was in Clinical Pastoral Education with six other students, we spoke of our group as being in a boat together. When someone did something that affected the rest of us, we named that it "rocked our boat." When we had times of



difficulty with conflicting points of view, we named that we were weathering storms. One of the other students did not realize how he had distanced himself from the group until we named that he was no longer in the boat.

Life always has storms within it. Our challenge is to survive them. As humans we don't like when someone or something "rocks our boat." We want smooth sailing. And yet, smooth sailing does not challenge us to think or grow, but rather lulls us into a fall sense of security. We begin thinking this is how life is meant to be, and yet sometimes we do not speak or act out of our loving hearts.

If the church is a boat, Church of the Apostles is an ocean liner which only changes course one degree at a time unless there is a storm. Things have happened this year which "rocked our boat" and the water has felt rougher than we like. Recently, it has felt like the church has pulled a "Crazy Ivan" which is a nautical term for a 90 degree change in course. So naturally, some have fallen off the boat, some are barely hanging on to the side rails, and some are running around trying to stabilize the boat.



As Jesus grew, he learned about the storms of life. So when he began his ministry, he called us to "metanoeo" which has been translated as repentance; however, the Greek actually means "a change of heart" or a transformation. We are not to conform to our culture which values wealth, power and war. We are to be people of love – people who are called to love our neighbors.

When life rocks our boat, may we remember Jesus' teachings and seek to be loving to all.

Letter from the President

here has been a lot going on....I have a hard time keeping things straight right now, and it's hard to find a free night in my calendar. When things get crazy I tend to just fall into all the routines so I don't have time to think...autopilot works wonders!! Autopilot and old routines don't always mean that I'm making the right decisions...or any decisions at all for that matter!

I have always operated under the belief that communion should be reserved for when my children are confirmed. At that age they are aware of the significance of the sacrament and can participate in it completely. Over the past few years I have wavered a bit on that, and over Lent Finn did receive his first communion. During the communion at the beginning of October, it hit me. All are welcome. I truly believe that ALL are welcome, however I have not welcomed my own kids! I have invited all to share with me in the church sacraments but turn to Finn and tell him he is not old enough. I have prohibited him from receiving the spirit that comes with the sacraments. Does it really matter if he does not fully understand? Do any of us fully understand? Allowing God to move at His will is the point, not for me to micromanage it. That is what inclusivity means, not micromanaging who we include; or exclude for that matter...and allowing God to use us to show His love.

How does God use you to show his love? Morever. . .do you allow Him? Do we even recognize in this crazy world that He still tries?

All I need to do is look at Finn, and I know that God is at work. A friend of his had a break-in at his home this past

week and Finn is arranging to replace some of the stolen things. If that is not God's love in our world...I don't know what is.

Most times, children show us God's love more freely. As adults we are guarded. We protect ourselves by micromanaging our emotions with others. We turn on autopilot and rely on routines to guide our decisions. The world is changing and old routines may not fit today's situations. We need to break down those walls, lower our barriers and let others in, more importantly let God in. We can't show His love to all we meet if we don't allow Him in!

PASTORAL LEADERSHIP FOR THE 2019-2020 SCHOOL YEAR

Stephanie Dorsey — Will continue as the contracted part -time Interim Associate Pastor during her last year in seminary for 15 hours per week.

Jonathan Paredes — Will serve as our Seminary Intern for 6-8 hours per week and give us an additional 5 hours.

Cathy Kenlin — is a seminary-trained gifted writer within our congregation who has also agreed to help.

With the objective to empower this team to work out of their strengths, their roles and responsibilities are outlined below:

Stephanie – Worship leadership liturgy writing for the 10:45 AM service, preaching every 4-6 weeks, adult education classes, leading member and hospital visitations and assisting with confirmation

Jonathan – Worship leadership with some writing for the 9:15 AM service, preaching monthly, assisting with weddings & funerals, member and hospital visitations, youth group leadership and fellowship opportunities

Cathy – Writing weekly devotionals and liturgy for 9:15 AM service, adult education classes on spiritual practices and prayer.

Pastor Kuhn – Oversight and mentoring of all the listed assignments, Worship design and preaching 2 to 3 times per month; supporting leadership of children's educational programming; confirmation and youth group; visitation in critical situations; collaborating with the leadership of standing commissions, Council and it's subcommittees, Executive Committee, Growth Task Force, Ministry Planning, Spiritual Council, Music Ministry; maintaining connections with Conference, Ministerium, LTS, Community Service Organizations; and supporting office staff and property manager.

Although this is not the arrangement we expected, our leadership feels that it will be the best arrangement for this year. The Search Committee will resume reading profiles in 2020 to find a full-time associate. We hope that you will also be an active supporting presence in the ministries of our congregation as we seek to grow and more fully become the church God is calling us to be.
