or this year's Advent season, we will be exploring the theme of joy as we begin to celebrate the 300<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the hymn "Joy to the World" by Isaac Watts. During the time of waiting and expectation, we will name that joy is not the same as happiness. It is not something light-hearted or merry. Joy is from a place within our souls, an emotion placed there by Christ for us to appreciate.

The challenge is to know this joy while in times of frustration and suffering. The joy that Christ has given us is not affected by the world, money or material possessions. It is not based on our present circumstances or how other people feel or think about us. It is what Ebenezer Scrooge learns each Christmas season - that it is connected to the compassion and empathy we have for others. It is known in being part of establishing God's justice in the world. We experience it when we let go of our expectations and judgements. We experience it when we seek to look at all of creation as Christ sees it, as a new parent sees their newborn for first time.

If we want to talk about issues, we can divide into many factions. However, Jesus's birth was not about dividing but bringing people together; those of different classes like the shepherds and the innkeeper, those of different educational backgrounds like the magi and the town folk, and those with much faith and those with little. That is still who gathers on Christmas Eve - those who worship weekly and those who only come on Christmas – and we all get to hear that we are cherished children of God. We are also gifts from the holy to humanity.

Jesus Christ is the Joy-Made-Flesh! May we come to celebrate that together! Blessings & peace,



### Giving Report • October 2019

The cash flow for month ending October 31, 2019 was negative (\$77,760.06) for the year 2019 to that date. Same time last year was negative (\$83,017.10). Operating Expenses through October 2019 were \$485,298.10, Revenue \$407,538.04. Same time last year \$483,410.38 for Expenses, \$400,393.28 for Revenue.

### What is a Chrismon Tree?

For this Advent season, Church of Apostles will display a Chrismon Tree in the narthex. All white and gold ornaments and Chrismons are being made by members (both adults and children) of our church.

The Chrismon Tree originated at Ascension Lutheran Church in Danville, VA in 1957. From that beginning, the idea has spread to Christians all over the world.

The evergreen tree, which symbolizes eternal life, is a background for tiny white lights and white and gold Chrismons.

The lights signify Jesus who is the light of the world, and the Chrismons (Christ + monogram) proclaim the name, the life, and the acts of Jesus.

All Chrismons are made in either white or gold or in a combination of the two colors. White is the liturgical color for Christmas, and suggests the innocence, purity and perfection of Christ. It is the color of joy.

Gold is a symbol for the glory and majesty of God.
