*From the Pastor...*

**C**hristmas is over and we are left with the person who we call Jesus the Christ. We say that Jesus has been born in our hearts again, and yet, what does that mean? Who is this person of Nazareth? He is divine? He is human? These are the questions we hope to wrestle with during the season of Epiphany so that we may each have our own epiphany of greater understanding.

Our worship season begins with the arrival of the magi and quickly shifts to Jesus' baptism by John and the beginning of his ministry. This year we will be reading Matthew's account of Jesus and hear how Matthew names him as the Messiah, the long-awaited One. And yet, not all believed. Where are we in what we believe about Jesus? Do we expect Christ to make a difference in our world today? Do we see signs of Jesus' activity in our time?

Our worship theme for this season is called "Wholly Human, Holy Divine" as we ask questions like: What is it that made Jesus so present in himself? Because we tend to hide behind our makeup and our masks to deny our own bodies and the importance of our health. What can we learn from Jesus about our own embodiment, especially as we look at our own mortality? How can we also be a gift to others?

Deep questions to help us consider how best to live this one life we have been given. I hope you join us on the journey!

Operating Expenses through November 2019 were \$527,469.82, Revenue \$447,627.50. Same time last year \$528,505.85 for Expenses, \$452,441.43 for Revenue.

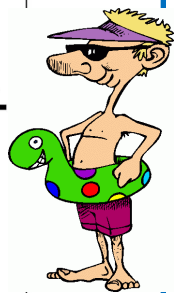

## The Impact of Climate Change

I want to tell you about a novel my husband read last year. [New York 2140](#) is a dystopian story by Kim Stanley Robinson, and was nominated for the Hugo Award in 2018. Set in the future, it's the fictional tale of the residents of one New York City apartment building. Or "island," if you prefer – because in this future, the streets of Manhattan have become canals, and its skyscrapers are all islands.

**There's only one problem with this "fictional" future.** According to the United Nations Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, sea levels *are* rising. Moreover, the rate at which they're rising is picking up speed, thanks to the melting of the Antarctic and Greenland ice sheets. And depending on which models you use, we're talking between 10-25 meters (that's 32-82 feet) of sea level rise. **Which means that New York City could, indeed, be under some water by 2140**

When I was at General Synod last year, I got to speak with Rev. Dr. Terry Gallagher in the exhibit hall. He's produced a video series summarizing not only the negative impacts that human-caused climate change has had on the planet so far, but also positive steps we all can take to turn the tide before it's too late. We'll be using this column over the next 6 months to summarize some of what we've learned from this series.

It's hard to think about the fact that our collective human actions have caused so much damage to this planet that we call home. We like all the technological benefits and human comforts that have come from 150 years of burning fossil fuels. We don't want to give up those comforts, and we think it would be too expensive to enjoy them without using fossil fuels in the process.

But here's the thing:

Dealing with massive hurricanes, heatwaves, winter storms, and wildfires – all of which have been increasing in recent decades – ***is already really expensive***. In terms of not only dollars and cents, but human lives.

***There are technologies and solutions ALREADY OUT THERE that can help us live without fossil fuels AND SAVE MONEY at the same time!***

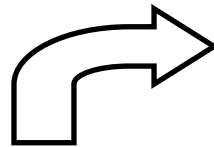
