Dear Friends.

Thank you for your willingness to engage in a deliberate time of prayer over our future vision and direction. For some time, we have been listening and discerning how Christ wants us to impact our community. On Sunday, July 19, I laid out for the congregation three large issues for our prayerful discernment. These issues are: homelessness/housing in Lancaster County; the education of our children; and food insecurity/feeding the hungry in our community. I ask that you write them down and read them during your personal prayer time. I ask that you pay attention to the news articles you see, noticing what is catching your attention and listening to what your heart is saying.

These issues are purposefully large, and once we choose one, we will begin a time of research into the issue by engaging those within our community that are already doing this work. We are not going to "reinvent the wheel" or try to do something on our own, but we will listen to the work being done in the area and for where we feel that we can make the impact God is calling us to make. If we look at the biblical stories, no great effort happens without a cost. So whatever we do will cost us something! And in that cost, or by taking that risk, we will grow spiritually. That will be a helpful benefit as we deepen our relationship with Jesus Christ.

In the next weeks, you will receive a survey, electronically or via the postal service. The survey will be asking for your wisdom with different aspects of our life together and will contain questions to help guide us to a decision regarding these issues. Once decided ,we will turn our efforts and energy in that direction as we move together toward God's kin-dom in our community.

Thank you again for your faithfulness to God and your trust in our Still Speaking God.

ight now I'm finding things hard to balance. In fact, finding the time to sit down to write this month's Crown article was quite a challenge. One thing that was really important to me, prior to our shutdown, was sitting in the church service. Taking that deep breath in and centering myself was a reset for my week. Now. . .don't get me wrong, I am so grateful to the entire team that continues to bring us our weekly service. I know for some, finding the balance of when to leave their homes and venture out is a struggle. So those tapings are invaluable.

Because we all have struggles that we need to breathe through — be it grief, loneliness, child rearing, marriage, illness, debt, or the multitude of other daily stressors.

God has a way of helping us find the important things to focus on. He reminds me that, of all the things that are running through my mind, I'm not weighed down with finding a way to feed my children, or put a roof over their heads. The fact that I am completely overwhelmed at work means that I have a job, and not only that, I have job security. There is a blessing in that, but I don't have time to sit down and appreciate it until I walk through the doors at Church of the Apostles. Finding the blessings amongst all the clutter is the goal for balance. . . and all blessings start and end with God.




A Message from Pastor Joe

In Diana Butler Bass' "Grateful" series, she speaks of a profound experience with a Native American dance circle. In the midst of a diverse crowd of people, a group of Native American women began to dance in a circle. As their hearts swelled with the passion of the dance, the women began expanding the circle by personally inviting others to join in. This small group grew and grew as more people were caught up in the joy and the passion of the dance. At last, one dancer reached out to Bass. The joy Bass had watched as a spectator began to sink into her flesh and her bones as she physically gave herself over to the dance.

Reflecting on this imagery, I wonder what dance of joy and passion we, as Church of the Apostles, are inviting people to share in? In asking this question, it is important to recognize that the Native American women were inviting people to join into the dance because they were overflowing with joy and passion from the dance they were already engaged in. In other words, they were inviting people in because of an abundance they were experiencing. This is far different than the scarcity mindset that drives much of mainline Christian evangelism where the explicit or implicit message is often times, "join the dance because I am getting too tired to dance it anymore." However, with the Native American women, what they were offering was a pure gift. What they offered was joy, laughter, passion, and community that when received brought others to join into a dance centered in life.

Obviously in this time of physical distancing, literally grabbing hold of someone for a dance is not the greatest idea. However, as people stand on the sidelines of life, it still remains critical that we reach out with invitations to God's dance of life. To this end, each Sunday during our 10 am outdoor worship, you'll be invited to reach out beyond the circle of the gathered church. Each week, as we share Christ's peace of reconciliation and healing with each other, you'll also be invited to share a word of blessing, hope, peace, or love with someone who is not there. In doing so, the prayer is that the sharing of our dance may bring others to know and experience the joy-filled dance of life shared with God.

May our dance be one of God's joy! With Christ's Blessings,

MEDICAL DEBT REDUCTION

Church of Apostles joined with the Parish Resource Center and 19 other congregations in the Lancaster Area to erase the medical debt of 1299 people in Lancaster County. In fact, our efforts were able to pay off the medical debt of 161 people from Chester, 41 people in Dauphin, 93 people in Lebanon, and 103 people from York Counties as well.

The average debt per person was \$767.05. All 1,697 people received a letter explaining the cancellation of their debt. Imagine the relief of these people. Some have been hounded by collection agency after collection agency for years. Knowing that the debt has now been forgiven, and removed from their credit rating, is awesome news. 
CARE KITS




WORSHIP AT PLOW CIRCLE • SUNDAYS • 10 AM


Family Science in the Park

Tracks & Scat. Even though the month is over, you can still




