## A Message from the Council Vice President

Who Moved My Cheese, a book I read and studied in the late 1990s, keeps coming to my mind recently as I engage with committees and membership of Church of the Apostles. If you aren't familiar with the book, written by Spencer Johnson, it is an allegorical tale about mice and humans in a maze looking for "cheese", which is representative of happiness and success. Once the cheese is found all are happy and content, eventually the cheese runs low, and change occurs. The mice seek out a new cheese supply while the humans, fearful of leaving the comfort of what they are accustomed to, keep going back to the empty supply. Eventually one of the humans realizes that fear of the unknown has taken over, and the only way out of a bad situation is to embrace the motto: What would you do if you weren't afraid?



In our world today there appears to be much to fear. Explo-

sions, pandemics, mass shootings, prejudice, hate... the list could be endless. As people of faith, God is the answer to our fears. A loving God who is working for the good of all people. The Bible reminds us in Isaiah 41: "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."

At the group facilitator workshop all of your thoughts and dreams for the church were consolidated into statements and phrases. These phrases were shared with all and participants each chose three statements they felt best represented their small group. This process was repeated for our Core Values, Vision and Mission. Barbara Achtermann carefully tallied the votes and typed the handwritten words.



Jeannie Clausen, James DeBord, Lou Gaudioso, Milt Gockley, Jim Stoltzfus, Flo Waldron and Terry Wilson worked incredibly hard to ensure that the words used in the new statements authentically captured the values set forth by the congregation. As the scribe for the summit, I saw firsthand the consideration that went into each and every word, but ultimately, it was easy to come to a consensus. That's because it all came from you!

This month, you will have the opportunity to sit with the proposed Vision and Mission statements. You will have a chance to share your thoughts with the Vision Writers. All opinions are welcome, however, the Vision Writers will not make any changes without careful and prayerful consideration in order to preserve the integrity of the process.

Once the Vision and Mission are affirmed by the congregation the real work begins. How exciting! I have personally felt a shift in the energy of the church. I hear it in your singing during the service and I see it in your smiles during fellowship. The Spirit is moving through us! Let's keep the momentum going!

Songs of Thankfulness to Develop an Attitude of Gratitude

Gratitude is an important part of our faith. This ability to be thankful for people, events, and blessings in our lives is good for both our physical and mental well-being, as well as an important part of our spiritual formation. Gratitude is also contagious: when we express it to others, they are also more likely to gift it forward. The scriptures offer us wisdom and guidance on how we can grow a spirit of thanksgiving in our hearts.

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God." (Philippians 4:6)

"Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." (1 Thessalonians 5:18)

Worship songs offer inspiration in nurturing a transformative attitude of gratitude. The popular worship song "Forever" by Chris Tomlin speaks to thankfulness:

"Give thanks to the Lord our God and King His love endures forever For He is good, He is above all things His love endures forever"

According to Tomlin, this iconic praise song was not written quickly. He was able to write the verses swiftly enough, but the chorus took significantly longer to work out. In total, the song took four years to complete.

There are also numerous hymns of praise and thanksgiving that offer insight and encouragement in developing gratitude. "Praise to the Lord the Almighty" written by Joachim Neander is one such hymn:

> "Praise to the Lord, the Almighty, the King of creation! O my soul, praise him, for he is thy health and salvation! All ye who hear, now to his temple draw near; praise him in glad adoration."

Neander wrote this hymn around the year 1680. He was a prolific hymn writer, writing approximately 60 hymns before he died of tuberculosis at the age of 30. May we strive as a community to grow our faith through acts of gratitude in all things.



Let's talk about Faith Formation. Faith Formation is the process by which our faith grows, and our lives are shaped by God's love. Faith Formation class is a great way to set a foundation of faith for our children. What a rewarding and important opportunity it presents for Faith Formation teachers.

The Shine curriculum teacher's guide lays out a simple plan for each week. It includes a Bible story, prayers, games, crafts, and a worksheet for each child. Teachers are offered weekly compensation. In addition, teachers are required, by Safe Church policy, to obtain criminal and child abuse clearances. The office staff can assist with obtaining.
