### Pastor's Corner - Happy New Year

In case you missed it and didn't have a big party and celebration, the western church has started a new 3-year cycle of the lectionary. Our liturgical (church) calendar does not begin on January 1st but instead on the first Sunday of Advent. This year on November 27th (first Sunday of Advent) we began again with "Year A". We use the lectionary as appointed daily scripture readings for each day for 3 years. In the church, pastors often preach from the lectionary readings for the appropriate Sunday. Pastors are not obligated to use these scriptures and most choose their own, especially when doing a sermon series as we have done this fall at Apostles. We can use the lectionary to structure our personal scripture reading time. One shortcoming of the lectionary is that it does not cover the entire Bible and often skips over the difficult passages. The major difference is the gospel that it focuses on during Advent.

Year A: Gospel of Matthew

Year B: Gospel of Mark

Year C: Gospel of Luke

Gospel of John is covered during Easter

Historically, the lectionary comes from unknown and mysterious origins. No one knows when it was instituted but Jewish history makes claims to having specific texts read during the time of Moses. Christians have references to assigned scripture readings dating back to the early church in the 3rd century, which was probably an adopted influence from the Jewish practice. Of course, the church being the church does not use the same lectionary. Until the 2nd Vatican council in the 1960s, most of the church used John Wesley's one year cycle lectionary, while the Heidelberg Catechism was divided into a 52-weeks lectionary and used by the Reformed Churches. Our current version, *The Revised Common Lectionary, was* introduced in 1992. Vanderbilt Divinity School hosts a very easy-to-use online version at <a href="Lectionary.library.vanderbilt.edu">Lectionary.library.vanderbilt.edu</a>.

# A MUSICAL NOTE

WITH LARS POTTEIGER

What is your favorite Christmas carol? I've been asked this question on more than one occasion, but struggle to choose a single piece as there are so many wonderful options in the canon. I do have a favorite collection of carols that was penned in 1942 by Benjamin Britten while crossing the Atlantic Ocean on a ship returning to England. Ceremony of Carols is one of Britten's most famous works and is one I highly recommend if you have not heard it before. I enjoy this piece so much, I make a point of listening to it at least once a year around Christmas time.

Ceremony of Carols is a collection of ten carols that is framed by a medieval chant melody. These carols date from the fourteenth to the sixteenth centuries, yet sound both modern and timeless. Britten arranged these carols for a unique ensemble that is lighter in tone and overall sound; he uses a three-part children's choir with solo voices and harp. This is an atypical ensemble compared to most other Christmas pieces that often employ brass, full choir, and organ. Ceremony of Carols is lighter in tone because of this choice in orchestration, but preserves fiery and exciting moments. Britten took the text from The English Galaxy of Shorter Poems, which is primarily written in Middle English, with some Early Modern English and Latin as well. He combines all these elements into a beautifully compelling and unique piece of Christmas music.
