#### **Pastor's Corner**

"The Word became flesh and dwelt among us, full of grace and truth; we have beheld his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father." – John 1:14

The hope we celebrate in this season of Advent and Christmas is the incarnation – the miraculous and grace-filled gift of the divine Creator deliberately taking on the flesh of this world in order that we may know and experience God's love in a physically, tangible manner. In other words, God became like us. God lived among us. Through Jesus, God physically shared in what it means to be human with us. We see this in the range of emotions Jesus expressed. We see it as well in the ways he touched those around him (insiders and outsiders) and the ways in which people embraced and touched him. Ultimately, the fullness of his humanity, and his tangible compassion for us, was found in the blood that flowed from his body on the cross.

Even before Jesus' advent into the world, the scriptures spoke of the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob being a God of compassion, mercy, and grace. There are plenty of stories in the Old Testament that speak to this. But to hear a word about God's love is far different than experiencing that love in the flesh. To experience that love is earth-shattering. It changes everything. It gives cause for angels to sing, shepherds to leave their sheep, and light to pierce this world's darkness.

Ironically, as 21<sup>st</sup> century Christians, we have a tendency to invert the incarnation story - turning the flesh back into the Word. We have a tendency to make our faith, to make Jesus, about what we think or intellectually believe instead of the reality we live in our being. And though there is a need for good theology, theology that is disembodied from our flesh is void of the deep hope of Jesus.

Thankfully all that we need has already been given. In Jesus, the Word has been made flesh, and through the power of the Holy Spirit, it has been poured into our lives as well. In this season, I pray for you more than a merry Christmas. I pray that Christ may be born in you. I pray that your life, your heart, your soul, your being may be the abode through which Christ's love takes on physical form for others. And I pray that within this incarnate reality of God's love you may be filled with joy that exceeds your every expectation. Because there is nothing so powerful as another person looking into your eyes with the belief that they are staring into the face of God through you.

"To all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God; who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God." – John 1:12-13

#### Realm – Electronic Giving & Text to Give Now Available on Realm

You can now give to the church's ministries directly through Realm either by logging into your Realm account or through the Realm Connect App. You can also now text to give by texting the keyword "COA" to 73256. Just like our current online give page, these give options allow you to give to the General Fund and Special Offerings. These are just some

of the new features now available to you because of our transition to Realm.

**Please note:** this does not change anything of our existing ways to give electronically. It simply provides one more option. We will continue to receive electronic gifts through VancoMobile, established automated contributions will not change, and our online give page will continue as is. However, with Realm you will no longer need a separate login or app. Check it out today!

#### **Updating Automatic Contributions for 2022**

A quick reminder that you have the ability to update your automatic contributions by logging into your E-giving account. Your account can be accessed through the VancoMobile app or the church give page. The office does not make changes to automatic contributions based upon pledge cards. However, if you need assistance making changes to your automatic contributions, you are welcome to stop into the office so that we might assist you or if needed provide you with an authorization of change form.

#### Giving Numbers Updated & Giving Envelopes Ready for Pickup

Due to the number of people switching to e-giving and other forms of giving this last year, we have undergone a process of redevelopment for our giving numbers starting January of 2022. The new numbering system takes into account the variety of ways to give: envelopes, online, bank bill pay, and others.

For those using envelopes you will see your new 2022 giving number when you pick up your giving envelopes this December. Envelopes will be available for pick up starting December 12<sup>th</sup> either at worship services or by stopping by the church office. Everyone else will be able to see their new giving number in early January by logging into your Realm account or by contacting the church office.

With this transition, please make sure the church has received all your 2021 giving (using your 2021 number) by December 31st. Then starting January 1st, begin using your new giving number and envelopes.

#### Market Basket (Grocery Cards)

Are you willing to earn **5% cashback** for our church just by purchasing your usual groceries? At absolutely no cost to you! We hope so! That's why our sale of Grocery Cards here at COA continues undaunted while COVID safety precautions continue.

On the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Sundays of each month, you may order (with payment by cash or check) Stauffers (\$50), Giant (\$50), or Weis (\$50) Grocery Cards. Some cards may be available for immediate purchase and use. Purchased cards are useable the same as cash at the appropriate grocery stores. There are a couple ways to purchase grocery cards currently:

1. You may order cards (with payment at time of order) OR (to be paid for upon receipt) to be picked up on the first 2 Sundays of the following month. Cards may be ordered in the vestibule or on the sidewalk outside on the 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> Sundays of December as well as succeeding months, following each worship service. Simply complete an availa-



- ble order form and attach your payment (check payable to COA with Market Basket on the memo line) or cash.
- 2. You may order cards for immediate purchase and pickup (we often, but not always, have some extra cards beyond the number that have been pre-ordered) by phoning Karen Helmeczi (717-299-2972) or emailing to: kjhelmeczi@gmail.com. Arrangements can be made to pick up and pay for these cards (check to COA as above or cash) on Sunday mornings or other convenient times or at the Helmeczi residence in Homestead Village (1832 Westcott Drive) very near the church or other negotiated locations.

#### WHAT ABOUT THE ORPHANS OF TODAY?

At the season of Advent and Christmas, Church of Apostles joins with other churches of the Penn Central Conference, to honor the ongoing work of two exceptional missions to children with a **Special Offering**.



Through **Bethany** and **Hoffman Homes**, we, **you and me**, *provide a reason for living* to despondent children. The need is real! Just read this story about *Abby*.

Abby was hospitalized with suicidal thoughts. She needed a place away from the physical and emotional abuse of her mother. She needed care to work through trauma, anxiety, sadness, self-harm, and aggression. Her therapy sessions at **Hoffman Homes** focused on improving her sense of self-worth, learning self-soothing skills, processing her trauma, and improving family relationships.

An equine-assisted therapy program ignited a passion for animals and helped *Abby* learn to feel and express empathy and compassion. In the period of a year, her mood improved, she had cheerful interactions with her father on the phone, she was getting good grades at school, and family visits went well.

Recently, *Abby* returned home to live with her father. She is volunteering at a stable. She aspires to be an equine-assisted therapist. Hoffman provides moral support. Right now there are 76 children like *Abby* in care at Hoffman Homes at a cost of \$410/da/ea. The average gap between what state and county agencies, or insurances contribute to this care is about \$63/da/ea. Bethany's figures are comparable. Last year Church of Apostles sent these homes \$1,100. (that's 17 days for one child) **WE CAN CHANGE** the lives of children! Just one *success story* like this *gives reason to rejoice*, open our hearts, *and financially support* these two missions envisioned in the 1800's by churches just like ours!
