A Musical Note

WITH LARS POTTEIGER

Of the many carols sung at Christmas, few are as well known and beloved as "Silent Night." Translated into over 300 languages and performed in a variety of musical styles, this carol had humble origins in a small Austrian town before it became well known around the world. The text was written by the young Austrian priest, Joseph Mohr, in 1816 commemorating the peace that had finally come after the Napoleonic Wars had ravaged Europe. He revisited the poem several years later in the winter of 1818 when the river Salzbach flooded the church he was serving. The organ was sadly damaged in the flooding thereby preventing music for Christmas, so Mohr contacted his friend, teacher and church organist Franz Gruber to compose a melody for the text of "Silent Night." The duo then sang it with a guitar accompaniment played by Mohr after the conclusion of the Christmas Eve service, as guitar was not permitted in church services at the time.

The song may have remained known only within the local community if it weren't for the organ repairman who came to the church to repair the organ after the flood. He took a copy of "Silent Night" back to his village where it was sung by different choirs in that area and also spread throughout Europe by two traveling families of folk singers. One of these traveling folk ensembles, The Rainer family, debuted the carol in 1839 in New York City. Subsequently, the carol was also translated and disseminated by traveling missionaries. One of the most touching stories surrounding the significance of this carol occurred during WWI on Christmas Eve in 1914. Europe was once again ravaged by war. On this most holy night, a truce was declared, and Germans, French, English, and American soldiers put down their weapons for the night and celebrated the holiday in the trenches. They sang "Silent Night" in their respective native languages and had a moment of respite from the bloodshed and destruction, showing in a powerfully profound way how this carol speaks to the universality of our shared humanity even in the most difficult of circumstances.




