Pastor's Corner

The Season of Lent begins this year on Wednesday, February 22 with our Ash Wednesday service at 7 PM in the sanctuary. With Lent, I want to challenge us to be more purposeful and aware of our discipleship by taking on three spiritual disciplines. They are:


- Attend worship each week to be part of the community and intentionally meet others you don't know yet. Using Jonathan's words, "Be the church. Come to church."
- Increase your giving of time and money to show yourself that you can make God's work a priority in your life. Practicing good stewardship of our resources is an act of ministry.
- Do an act of justice or mercy each week with the confidence that opportunities will present themselves. This may be as simple as giving a larger tip to the one who serves your table or cuts your hair. It may be an act of forgiveness for one who needs to hear it.

During our worship series for this season, we will focus on the spiritual discipline of "letting go." We will explore letting go of our selfishness, our need for power, our cultural norms that limit us, our perceptions which keep us from seeing others with love and grace, our expectations which lead to disappointments, and our desire to control our lives and that which is in it. The thought of "letting go" can be a scary premise until we remember that we trust in the one who loves us more than we understand. This is to whom we are "letting go." Our "letting go" allows Christ to move within us and speak to us in ways that lead to more joy-filled living.

May we trust God enough to be willing to let go. Or at least, be willing to be willing to let go!

- Able to lead communication for team members.
- Able to facilitate in the absence of the lead facilitator.

Group diversity is important, so spouses should not facilitate within the same group. Facilitators will be trained on April 2nd after the 10:00 service. They will be fully supported by Agile church as we move through the project. Please call the office if you would be willing to serve in this way.

Upper Room Daily Devotionals





A Musical Note

WITH LARS POTTEIGER

"Agape is something of the understanding, creative, redemptive goodwill for all men. It is a love that seeks nothing in return. It is an overflowing love; it's what theologians would call the love of God working in the lives of men. And when you rise to love on this level, you begin to love men, not because they are likeable, but because God loves them." Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

We don't really celebrate Valentine's Day in church, or do we? This holiday originated as a feast day celebrating Saint Valentine and acts by martyrs in the early Christian church. Our more contemporary approach to celebrating this holiday came about in the 14th and 15th centuries, where people in some countries shifted the focus in this celebration to romantic love, as an ideal of courtly love flourished in Europe. Our more modern traditions for this holiday stem largely from this influence.

The Ancient Greeks had seven words for love, each with a different meaning. In the quote above, Dr. King uses one of these Greek terms; agape is considered to be a type of love that shows a love for God and strangers, or love that is exemplified through charitable acts. When considering a meaning of love through this lens, I think of how much we are encouraged to do this through our faith already. It's as if daily we are called to celebrate this type of love in our lives! I often pray for the ability to love in a way that Dr. King describes in his quote - selflessly and loving others as God first loved us. This is important because there are times we are all unlikeable, but God still loves us. We are encouraged to love in this way in many of the hymns we sing, prayers that we use in worship, and scriptures that we read. This type self-sacrificing love that is called for in the Greek word agape connects more closely to the essence

and spirit of the original celebration of Valentine's Day as compared with a more modern celebration that focuses on chocolate, flowers, and romantic love. What are some new ways you can demonstrate *agape* with family, coworkers, and friends this February? How can understanding *agape* enrich our celebration of Valentine's Day and give us a new perspective in faith?

The Apostles Academy is hosting a concert featuring the Temple Avenue Jazz Band on February 26th at 3pm in the sanctuary. This talented ensemble met while in school at Temple University and still performs regularly throughout southeastern and central PA. I hope that you are able to attend and experience this wonderful band!
