#### **Pastor's Corner**

Jesus said, "You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and love your neighbor as yourself." – Luke 10:27

With a new year, it is appropriate for us to reflect on what is most important to us and what we are to be as a Body of Christ. As we have felt stymied the past year, I have found myself saying more and more that all we can do is the next most loving thing. In my reading, I hear people talk about life and faith coming down to love. Not a romantic or emotional love, but an "agape" love that cares about the well-being of others, a love that is interested and working towards a world where all are able to thrive. I believe this is what we are also being called to as a church.

During the seasons of Epiphany and Lent, we will be using the book *Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations* by Robert Schnase. This will be the basis for our worship series and monthly congregational conversations so that we can share with one another the thoughts arising from listening to the Holy Spirit. The practices we will explore are Radical Hospitality, Passionate Worship, Intentional Faith Development, Risk-taking Mission and Service, and Extravagant Generosity. None of these are new concepts but hopefully, Schnase's work with Rev. Motz and my reflections will help us to dream and imagine a different way of being the church in our community.

This will challenge us to go places that are uncomfortable or where we would not normally go on our own, but that is how Christ works. Jesus also did not go where the religious authorities expected him to go. Rather he went to the people who were hurting, to the places that were forgotten by the religious leaders, and to the "untouchables," not to convert them but to create relationships with them, to hear of their challenges and walk with them.

It matters how we live our lives, and when opportunities present themselves, we are called to love. Let us enjoy the journey together!

A quilt raffle brought \$100 that was donated to the Church's General Fund. The craft group will decide how their profits will be spent when they begin meeting again in Feb. ## Will Reading This 3-Minute Article Change Your Life?

#### **Dear Overwhelmed Sisters and Brothers in Christ**,

I'm grateful if you're even taking the time to read this, because I know the past 22 months have stretched you past the breaking point. You barely have time or energy to do the laundry, buy the groceries, or accomplish the rest of the "adulting" tasks we're supposed to have mastered by now. Every day brings coworkers with short fuses, clients at the end of their rope, and kids in crisis from spending nearly two years with everything "normal" in their lives upended.

I get it. I'm right there with you. It's no wonder you feel completely detached from Life Before, especially your life at COA. Part of you misses how you used to attend Sunday worship in person, let alone other church activities – so much has changed since the pandemic started. And yet, while part of you wishes you didn't feel so detached – misses that sense of community you felt when you first became a member of COA – there's no way you can sandwich anything else into your life right now, because Pandemic Life is even crazier than Life Before was.

And yet here I am, urging you to sign up for the **FINAL** round of the *Transforming Congregational Culture* book group with Pastor Joe, starting Wednesday Feb. 2. And maybe I, or one of the other 40 people who've already done this study, have already said to you "You should really consider joining – this is a great experience, and I learned a lot/grew a lot/it changed how I saw the world" etc.

If one of us HASN'T asked you in person yet, PLEASE consider joining this final round. If one of us asked you in September but you had too many things going on in the fall, PLEASE consider joining in February, now that your fall commitments and the holidays are behind you

If anything I've described above hits home for you, it's because I've been there too. I've got work and my family and the added layers of chaos that come with Pandemic Life, and I was hesitant when I signed up for the first round. A part of me thought I was insane for even TRYING to shoehorn another thing into my overstuffed schedule, especially during the summer.


But another part of me was longing for a deeper sense of connection – especially to Church of the Apostles - than I've felt since Life Before got ripped away from us **The Church Wide Book Study gave me that sense of connection**. I got to meet people from across the congregation, and we got to have *real conversations*. Turns out, I wasn't the only one feeling isolated and alone, and missing everything the pandemic has obliterated.

The Church Wide Book Study also helped me feel more connected to my faith than I have in decades. Reading the chapters and discussing with other COA members each week gave me a renewed sense of purpose and identity as a Christian. As I found my sense of faith restored and strengthened over the course of the study, I found myself reflecting on all the places in my life that led me to COA – and even reaching out to friends I haven't spoken to in years. Those rekindled connections to others outside of COA, as well as those within our church family, have helped sustain me through the ongoing months of this pandemic.

And finally, the Church Wide Book Study has opened my heart wider to how I can be a better Christian within my own (church) family. You've probably seen the articles and announcements, here and elsewhere, about our new ROOTED Christian Formation class for grades 4-8. Maybe you have youth who've participated in the class, along with my own children. That class would not be happening if I hadn't joined the Church Wide Book Study.

The sense of belonging I experienced in Book Study Round 1 meant so much to me, that I popped into Round 2 whenever I could, even though my fall schedule was even more hectic than my summer calendar. Round 3 will AGAIN include an evening Zoom option for all of us overbooked working parents, so I hope to pop in again during the Zoom meetings for this final session.

I sincerely hope to see you there, and that working through this book with other COA members will transform YOUR life the way it's transformed mine. For more information on how to register please see the church wide book study article on page 7.




#### **Market Basket (Grocery Cards)**

Are you willing to earn **5% cashback** for our church just by purchasing your usual groceries? At absolutely no cost to you! We hope so! That's why our sale of Grocery Cards here at COA continues undaunted while COVID safety precautions continue.

On the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Sundays of each month, you may order (with payment by cash, check or electronic payment) Stauffers (\$50), Giant (\$50), or Weis (\$50) Grocery Cards. #### MISSION to the HOMELESS SPECIAL OFFERING

On **January 16<sup>th</sup>** we will be collecting our annual Mission to the Homeless special offering. Over the years, this offering has helped support the efforts of local, national, and worldwide nonprofits who assist those struggling with homelessness in one form or another.

I'm sure many of you have been horrified and also stunned at the damage to the Midwest, especially Kentucky, reeked by the tornado earlier this week. I was so moved to hear a pastor from Mayfield interviewed on CNN speaking that while the devastation and loss of life was incomprehensible he had a sense of hope as he witnessed "heroes," families, neighbors and other volunteers come together and tire endlessly to help those affected. He remarked that it made him think that this is what heaven is all about. "Diverse peoples coming together in the devastation and working together to help." Using funds donated to our Mission to the Homeless offering in 2021 and funds made from our soup sale at the bazaar, we will be donating \$1000.00 to the Penn Central relief effort for this natural disaster.

In addition to disaster relief, \$750.00 was donated from this 2021 special offering to ABBA's House earlier this year. Located in Kenya and started by Reverend Simon and Margaret Muhota, this "House" serves a dual purpose as an orphanage and school through grade 5. Those in the orphanage, presently 35, and additional children in the neighboring area, another 25, are provided food, water, and a "good and Godly education" something church member Randy Leonard was moved by when she visited several years ago. The funds were used for supplies for the school and orphanage, as well as the purchase of a stove.

These donations could not be made without the support of all of you. Thank you for your continuing generosity.

#### **Rooted Kitchen Takeover**

#### **Homemade Latkes with Fresh Applesauce**

By the time you read this, the Grades 4-8 ROOTED Program's First Official Kitchen Takeover will be in the books. Here are the recipes we made that day, so you can try them at home, if you like:

#### Potato Latkes with Onion

Adapted from Chef Bill Telepan's Michelin-Star Potato Latkes at <a href="https://www.myjewishlearning.com/the-nosher/michelin-star-latkes-and-sufganiyot/">https://www.myjewishlearning.com/the-nosher/michelin-star-latkes-and-sufganiyot/</a>; serves 4-6

#### **Ingredients:**

2 lbs russet potatoes

1 medium onion

3 eggs

3 T flour

1 T salt

Cooking oil

#### Directions:

- 1. Place a colander over a mixing bowl. Using a large-hole box grater, grate first the potatoes and then the onion into the colander. Squeeze the mixture in the colander to remove excess moisture, allowing it to drain into the bowl underneath. Remove the colander and set it on a plate, to catch any remaining moisture that seeps out.
- 2. Allow the liquid in the bowl to settle, so the starch settles to the bottom; then carefully drain off the water from the top, leaving the starch on the bottom of the bowl. (A turkey baster works well for this.)
- 3. Add the eggs to the bowl and beat the egg-starch mixture together. Mix in the flour and salt. Then add the potato-onion mixture to the mixing bowl and combine thoroughly.
- 4. Line a plate with several layers of paper towel (to absorb excess oil). Add enough oil to a frying pan or electric skillet to cover the bottom; heat oil over medium-high heat (350 degrees for electric skillet). Using your hands, grab small handfuls of the potato mixture, squeeze lightly to remove excess moisture, place in heated cooking pan, and flatten slightly with a spatula; repeat until the pan is full.
- 5. Allow each latke to cook for a few minutes per side, until golden brown. Remove from the pan and place on paper-towel-lined plate in a single layer, adding more paper towel on top for each additional layer. Serve hot with fresh applesauce, sour cream, additional salt as desired, and/or salty cheese such as crumbled feta.

#### Fresh Applesauce

Adapted from Simple Applesauce in -- The Cook's Illustrated Cookbook (2011), p. 758; approx. 1.5-2 cups

#### Ingredients:

4 large apples (approx. 2lbs)

1/2 c. water

1/4 c. sugar

Pinch of salt

Notes: Preferred apple varieties are Jonagold, Jonathan, Pink Lady, or Macoun. If you have a Foley Food Mill or similar device, there's no need to peel the apples. If you don't have something along these lines for mashing the cooked apples and separating them from the peels, you will want to peel them before cooking.

#### Directions:

- 1. Core the apples and place in a microwave-safe container. Add water, sugar, and salt. Cover the container, and microwave on HIGH 6-8 minutes, or until apples are thoroughly cooked.
- 2. Place your Foley Food Mill over a bowl, pour in the cooked apple mixture, and process to separate out skins. If not using a Foley Food Mill, mash the cooked apples together to desired consistency. Serve warm, at room temperature, or chilled; refrigerate leftovers for up to one week.


