"Creating Community" has been a theme running through my mind since Easter. It began with the new furniture in the main lobby which invites conversation around tables and creates an atmosphere of hospitality. Through the Jeremiah project, I have had several members tell me that it has been life-giving to meet other members and have a greater understanding of who we are. I have heard of people wanting to continue to gather in social ways following the project because they enjoy being together.

Like the first disciples in the Book of Acts, we are better together. That was one of the large lessons from the pandemic. The old premise that one should "pull yourself up by your bootstraps" and be about your business is not enough. God created us as social creatures who need one another. And yet, in our country right now we are creating more and deeper divisions. Some historians have remarked that today's polarization is similar to what existed prior to the Civil War. That is not a part of history that we want to repeat!

We all want to be valued, heard and loved. So this summer, we are focused on creating community and encouraging compassion.

In Rader Park each Sunday at 9 AM, we will have Compassion Camp to remind us that all living things need shelter, food, air, water and community. In worship at our single 10 AM service, we will explore the scriptures to see how Jesus treats those he encounters and what he teaches about compassion and care

It was a great day in Rader Park for the students from Fulton Elementary who participated in our Science in the Park on May 9th. There were about 25 students, some of whom are just learning English. The students rotated through four activities. They did a stream study, a nature scavenger hunt, dissected owl pellets and went fishing. All of this was possible thanks to our amazing volunteers, who guided the students through each activity with enthusiasm and love, and exemplified the hymn "They will know we are Christians by our love". Thank-you to our amazing volunteers and we are looking forward to Science in the Park '24.

What Happens to Jeremiah in June?

The final Jeremiah Project session met on May 28th. **Thank you to those 91 people who participated**. The notes taken at each of those 48 sessions are being collated and weighted. Any idea that is mentioned in more than one group carries more weight. Any idea that parallels one of the 31 "focus" recommendations from the Agile Church Healthy Church Report will be noted as well.

Agile Church Consultants will visit us again on June 10th to review our progress with The Implementation Team and all the facilitators and co-facilitators of the Jeremiah Project. Look for a report from this meeting in the July Crown.

A select group of "wordsmiths" will translate our collective ideas into a mission and vision statement following the June 10th meeting. Wishing that they work independently and swiftly, individual "wordsmiths" will be identified only as they reveal the result of their work on our behalf. We have not yet established a deadline for that work. Please, pray for this group, and for patience from all of us as they deliberate.

A Musical Note

WITH LARS POTTEIGER

"For the Beauty of the Earth"

1) For the beauty of the earth,
for the glory of the skies,
for the love which from our birth
over and around us lies.
(refrain) - Christ, our Lord, to you we raise
this, our hymn of grateful praise.
-Folliott Sandford Pierpoint (1864)

"For the Beauty the Earth" is one of my favorite hymns. The text is beautifully poetic and reminds me to reconnect with God's bountiful creation with a sense of awe and wonder. It should come as no surprise that Pierpoint wrote this hymn while he was wandering around the English countryside in 1863. When singing this text, we are not only admiring God's creation, we are also expressing gratitude with each repetition of the refrain. As we become more connected through smartphones and computers, we sometimes forget to take time to "smell the roses." Japanese culture has a practice called "nature bathing," in which people spend time in natural spaces to decompress and recharge. This is approached like a form of meditation - the idea is to take in the natural world as it occurs in the moment, creating a mental break from everyday activities. It reminds me a bit of what Pierpoint did when he wrote this hymn.

We are blessed at Church of the Apostles to have a beautiful green space in Rader Park. If you have not spent time in the park, I hope that you will join us for one of our upcoming events. This summer the Apostles Academy of Arts and Sciences is proud to present a series of concerts in Rader Park at the pavilion. 

Lancaster Theological Seminary was founded in 1825 at Dickinson College in Carlisle, PA, as a seminar of what was then called the Reformed Church in the United States, often called the German Reformed to differentiate it from the Dutch Reformed or the Reformed Church in America. There was **one** professor, **five** students, and approximately **200** books in the theological library.
