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# A Message from the Council President

At the Council meeting held on Saturday, January 21, the following was confirmed by a vote of 11-0: In keeping with the Bylaws of the Church of the Apostles (III.D.1) "The Council shall meet at least *quarterly*". The decision of the Council was that for 2023, or until further notice, Council meetings will be held quarterly rather than monthly. The primary reasons for this change are twofold:

- a). To focus our attention more fully to the Agile Church project.
- b). Develop Council members that have a better understanding of how all the commissions of our church function.

Accordingly, each member of Council must either: Join an Agile Church team that will focus on accomplishing Agile Church healthy church checkup recommendations.

Or Attend a commission meeting (of which they are not a member) in each of the non-Council meeting months.

Shortly after Easter (week of April 16th) our Jeremiah project teams will begin to meet. The purpose of this project is to specifically define the *vision* and *mission* that God has for our Church at this time. This is a six-week small group study (meetings will be either in person or online) with each session being led by members of our church. Team leaders will be trained by the Agile Church Group to facilitate the content of the meetings. We ask that you prayerfully consider becoming a team leader or co-facilitator. If this is not your calling, we ask that you sign up as a group participant. This is an extremely important time in the life of our Church; in addition to your thoughts and prayers, we need your participation. Our Jeremiah project challenge is 80% participation among members who attend church in person or online. Team leaders, meeting places, dates, and times are listed in this edition of the Crown. Joining a group is key to helping our Church meet or exceed this participation goal to shape our future direction.


# Preschool News

# A Musical Note

WITH LARS POTTEIGER

A Passion play is a religious drama of medieval origins depicting the suffering, death, and resurrection of Christ. Passion music was an established form of musical expression in the Baroque era, but Bach elevated this tradition through his St. Matthew Passion. The text is from Matthew's gospel, chapters 26 and 27. Bach used a librettist to set text for the recitatives and arias, and interspersed harmonizations of well-known chorale melodies that would have been familiar to a listener in 1727. The St. Matthew Passion is three hours long and calls for two choirs, two orchestras, and soloists. Bach chose to write for a larger ensemble because St. Thomas in Leipzig, the church at which this work first premiered, had two separate choir lofts and organs. When it was originally performed on Good Friday, an hour long sermon was inserted between the first and second parts of the work. This piece was not readily received at the first performance because it was perceived as too operatic in nature. Bach's music fell out of favor after his death, but was revived in an 1829 performance that included Fanny and Felix Mendelssohn. This performance helped to create renewed interest in Bach's music, which has proliferated in the public ever since. I had the pleasure of performing this piece as a child in a youth choir as part of the Bethlehem Bach Festival. Not only is this piece a profound musical experience for both performer and listener, it also clearly depicts Bach's faith passionately expressed through sound.

The next event in the Apostles Academy Concert Series will feature the Amy Banks Quartet on April 30th at 3pm in the sanctuary. Banks is a sought-after jazz vocalist and performer in Lancaster and Central Pennsylvania, and is sure to deliver a high-energy performance with her ensemble.

Funds are used to provide clean water, food, education, and health care to those in areas of need, as well as providing funds for disaster preparedness and immediate action in times of crisis. 
