Pastor's Corner

"Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect." – Romans 12:2

Since Epiphany we have been using the book <u>Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations</u> by Robert Schnase as we consider how God is calling us into the future. Through this time we have been meeting in small groups to talk about Schnase's ideas and how they may apply to us. We have had conversations around how we can offer more hospitality to each other and to our guests. We have explored what passionate worship looks like for us and how we may be more intentional about our faith development.

This month we will be exploring risk-taking mission and extravagant generosity. We are a congregation who has always been strong in supporting outreach efforts and missions, particularly financially; however, Schnase challenges us to consider mission and service in terms of building relationships. It is about leaving our comfort zones to work with people who may be very different from us. In these situations, all parties gain from the experience that is shared. This is like sponsoring a refugee family through Church World Service and being a guide and source of hospitality as they adjust to the customs of our country and area. Extravagant generosity far exceeds what we usually call our offerings or giving to the church. This invites us to see our stewardship as how we share all of our resources with others like the first disciples in the Book of Acts. It is a pooling of resources so that all have what they need. How might we make our resources available to other groups within our community as a community partner?

An overarching theme in this book is asking us to reflect on how we engage our greater community. Do we know them? Might we offer them worship in a place where they naturally gather? Are there "hands-on" mission projects we can undertake to build relationships within the greater community or world? Listening for God's wisdom on questions like these is important work. I hope you join in the discussion sessions on the weeks of March 13th and March 27th.

A Message from the Council President

"Faith is taking the first step even when you can't see the whole staircase."

I was driving around town on errands and this church sign caught my eye. As I thought about it, the sentiment seemed to resonate with what we as a church congregation are being asked to do.....take that first step out to consider what a church vitality consultant might do to assist us with the future of Church of the Apostles. The first step is giving the OK to support forming an Investigation Team to look at the various organizations who do this work and what the best fit for our church might be. Many of you are taking part in some discussions about this when you have joined and participated in the group sessions about the "Fruitful Congregations" sermons. And these sessions are continuing through the month of March. You can still join in....call the church office to register or use the REALM app to sign up.

In doing some Bible study about this topic of faith, I found two passages that fit my thoughts on the topic: "Truly I tell you, if you have faith as small as a mustard seed you can say to this mountain: "Move from here," and it will move. Nothing will be impossible for you." - Matthew 17:20 and "Faith without works is dead." - James 2:17

The first passage reassures us that faith can move mountains; if we put our trust in God, his power can help US to move mountains. And following up; WE must do the works of faith in God. We need to put out trust in God's will for us and listen for his voice to direct our works. Some of those works involve getting involved in the discussion groups and lending your input to the effort. If an Investigation Team is formed, commit to being supportive and involved in following the efforts of the team. And if a consultant comes to COA, be involved with your participation of the work to revitalize COA for the coming years. Many good works directed by faith have come from members of our congregation; and many more will surely come.

Celebrating Service: Who Started the Aluminum Can Collection & Recycling Process for the Support of Rader Park?

Over 30 years ago, early in the morning, Pauline Brown would walk the streets where she lived and pick up aluminum cans and once she had a bag full, she took them to the recycling place on S. Prince Street. A Rader Park fund was started at the church for the money collected from those cans. Pauline did her can "pick-up" quietly for over ten years and during that time she raised \$4,000 for Rader Park.

Today many people save aluminum cans and bring them to the Youth Center. Tom Weaver continues that ministry of picking up those cans and taking them to a recycling canter. Without the ambitious effort of Pauline Brown many years ago, we might not have some of the useful additions at Rader Park today.

Church World Services Lancaster (CWS) is committed to showing welcome to refugees, immigrants, and asylum-seekers and other uprooted people within the United States who are seeking safety and the opportunity to rebuild their lives. For more than thirty years, CWS has welcomed thousands of new neighbors from around the world to our beautiful country. Through partnerships with faith groups, organizations and individuals, we empower our newest neighbors to build new lives in peace and security, providing up to five years of service and support.

They are now inviting church groups to form Welcome Teams to assist in the integration of refugees into our community. In the words of CWS, "Welcome Teams collaborate with CWS to empower a refugee family new to Lancaster by walking alongside them in intentional friendship, breaking through the cycle of isolation that oftentimes comes with being new to a community."

Responsibilities of Welcome Teams include:

- Setting up a household (furniture and home goods) for a family.
- Help them to integrate within Lancaster, assisting with transportation, clothing, health, conversation, community and cultural guide, financial education, job development, and schooling.

Market Basket (Grocery Cards)

Do you shop at **Stauffers, Giant** or **Weis** markets? Are you willing to earn 5% cashback for our church just by purchasing your usual groceries? At absolutely no cost to you! We hope so! That's why our sale of Grocery cards here at COA continues undaunted while covid safety precautions continue.

On the **first and second Sundays** of each month, you may order (with payment by cash, check or Realm) Stauffers (\$50), Giant (\$50), or Weis (\$50) Grocery Cards. Some cards may be available for immediate purchase and use. Purchased cards are useable the same as cash at the appropriate grocery stores. The benefit is that the church gets a 5% return from our bulk purchases of cards. These additional funds are then used to support our Outreach programs.

There are a couple of ways to purchase grocery cards currently:

- 1. You may order cards (with payment at time of order) OR (to be paid for upon receipt) to be picked up on the first two Sundays of the following month. You may now pay via the Realm site (plus courtesy fee). Cards may be ordered in the Narthex on the 1st and 2nd Sundays of the month, following each worship service. Simply complete an available order form, attach your payment (check payable to COA with Market Basket on the memo line), Realm or cash, and give it to the person at the table.
- 2. You may order cards for immediate purchase and pickup (we often, but not always, have some extra cards beyond the number that have been preordered) by phoning Karen Helmeczi (717-299-2972) or emailing to kihelmeczi@gmail.com. Arrangements can be made to pick up and pay for these cards (check to COA as above or cash) on Sunday mornings or other convenient times or at the Helmeczi residence in Homestead Village (1832 Westcott Drive) very near the church or other negotiated location.
