I lift up my eyes to the hills—from where will my help come? My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth.

As I watch the leaves and flowers emerge from their winter's rest, I am reminded of how heavily I have relied on the natural world to sustain me during the past two years. As we also begin to emerge from our socially distanced spaces and look to connect and reconnect, we want to create opportunities for that to happen naturally. Our coffee fellowship has restarted between services and will include snacks on the first Sunday of the month as we get used to eating together again.

Our worship services in May will be focused on the theme "The Gathering" as we listen to stories of how Jesus gathers folks and brings them back into community and healing. On the first Sunday in May, you are invited to bring along a mask you no longer need to hang on the tree in a ritual to name our grief and hear how Christ is revealed "in the breaking of the bread." On June 5th, we will gather in one worship service to celebrate Pentecost by confirming some of our youth and by welcoming some new members. Beginning with the next edition, we will be running a focus article on members beginning with our greeters. We have also included an article with the names of some former members who we are trying to reach.

We encourage you to take advantage of the opportunities as we look to regain and build our community together!

A Message from the Council President

I came across an interesting article which described an effort by a bus company in England to offer a "Chatty Bus" for the purpose of connecting lonely and isolated people to others who'd be willing to ride and have a conversation with others. They had found that at least 30% of all Britons go for at least one day each week without meaningful conversation. I'd bet if we did a similar survey in the USA, we'd find that is probably the case for us as well. And stretching that further.....for COA members, many of whom live alone or in a residential or nursing home community, I'm sure that is the case! Many of us have experienced the loneliness that comes from not having someone to talk to in a time of need.

The COVID-19 pandemic has strained the bonds between community members and our church as well. We need to re-establish CONNECTIONS! Now that restrictions on numbers of people attending worship or other events in the Fellowship Hall are loosening we can begin to get more people together.

The coffee cart is now available each Sunday after services which might encourage folks to grab a hot beverage and sit and chat a while. The first Sunday of each month, we will have a Hospitality Food Table....and we know, if you feed them, they will come (and sit and talk!!!!) If we all remember to wear our name tags when we come to worship, it will help us connect.

Butit may take more effort on all of our parts to re-forge those strained and even broken connections. I encourage you to think of someone that you don't see in church who used to attend on a regular basis. Consider writing them a note or calling them to let them know that you are thinking about them. Jot down the names that you hear mentioned in the prayers each Sunday and intentionally connect with those needing our support. And if you know of a member who lives near you, drop them a card with an offer to help them or visit them if desired.

The Apostle Paul encouraged the Colossian church members to let their conversations be always full of grace (Colossians 1:6) The next time you have an opportunity to connect deeply in conversation, with a COA member or another person you know, look for ways to spend some time in conversation that might be a blessing and an encouragement to both of your lives.

Market Basket (Grocery Cards) By Karen Helmeczi

On the **first and second Sundays** of each month, you may order (with payment by cash, check or Realm) Stauffers (\$50), Giant (\$50), or Weis (\$50) Grocery Cards. *Some cards may be available for immediate purchase and use.* Purchased cards are useable the same as cash at the appropriate grocery stores. The benefit is that the church gets a 5% return from our bulk purchases of cards. These additional funds are then used to support our Outreach programs.

There are a couple of ways to purchase grocery cards currently:

- 1. You may order cards (with payment at time of order) OR (to be paid for upon receipt) to be picked up on the first two Sundays of the following month. You may now pay via the Realm site (plus courtesy fee). Cards may be ordered in the Narthex on the 1st and 2nd Sundays of the month, following each worship service. Simply complete an available order form, attach your payment (check payable to COA with Market Basket on the memo line), Realm or cash, and give it to the person at the table.
- 2. You may order cards for immediate purchase and pickup (we often, but not always, have some extra cards beyond the number that have been pre-ordered) by phoning Karen Helmeczi (717-299-2972) or emailing to kihelmeczi@gmail.com. Arrangements can be made to pick up and pay for these cards (check to COA as above or cash) on Sunday mornings or other convenient times or at the Helmeczi residence in Homestead Village (1832 Westcott Drive) very near the church or other negotiated location.

Refugee Resettlement By Linda Lewis

A ministry team of a dozen people has formed to begin the process of resettlement of a refugee family. We are working with Church World Services, a nation-wide ecumenical organization whose purpose is the rehoming of refugees. Their office in Lancaster works with a number of Lancaster churches in forming "welcome teams", who help to set up homes for refugee families and then assist them in learning how to navigate the community. Many of these families are in refugee camps for 10-20 years before having the chance to come to America. They are heavily vetted by the U.S. State Department, the Department of Homeland Security, and others. They must receive a negative Covid test result before boarding their plane and then are quarantined for ten days upon arrival in Lancaster. At this point, we do not know the number of people in the family or the country of origin. CWS has recently rehomed families from Somalia and Afghanistan. They are currently awaiting families from the Ukraine.

The major focus of the Welcome Team at this point is to set up an apartment for the family, completely furnished with household goods and furniture. This is where we are asking the congregation for their help! There will be a poster near the Caring Cart with suggestions for household items for you to return to the cart as soon as possible. Sheets and towels must be new; all other furnishings can be gently used and in good condition. Other options include gift cards to Target, Wal-Mart, checks made out to Church of the Apostles, with "Refugee Resettlement" on the memo line, or contribute online. The Welcome Team is most appreciative of the faithful cooperation of our congregation in providing necessary home goods for the family that will be arriving soon. We are definitely "sharing Christ's love with all people"!
