A Message from the Council President

First and foremost, please mark your calendar for the Annual Meeting which will take place on Sunday, November 21 after the ONE SERVICE at 10:00 am. We need your attendance and participation. Special arrangements are being made for parking lot attendance/participation/and voting for those who still feel uneasy being inside the sanctuary. Feel free to speak with me or any Council member about any questions that you may have relating to the agenda which you will receive a minimum of 10 days before the meeting. Important items include our 2022 budget and voting on the slate of candidates for Council and other leadership roles.

Now for another important topic: Time, Talents, and Treasure. This time of year you may receive calls or letters or requests for any and all of these precious gifts that you have been given by God. We are all busy and have to judge where we give our time. Some may have been giving much for a long time and are tired, feeling that it is time for someone else to carry the load. With both of these sentiments, I feel your stress and understand the dilemma. But even for those who have given much, can you commit to helping a younger or more inexperienced member begin to assume some of the load?

But let's remember, God has gifted us all differently and blessed us with a good lifestyle and means of income and talents. What does it mean to give freely and without reservation? What I would say is that your gifts are special and chosen especially for you by God.

A gift of TIME is unique, because you are the only one who can give it. And it doesn't only mean serving on a commission or council. Office volunteers, garden workers and teachers for Faith Formation are some examples and always welcome. It may mean spending time praying daily for those in need, participating in a church book or group study, reading the scriptures to reflect on what God is saying to you or assisting people or organizations who need donations of your time.

Your gift of TALENT is given to us by God for use in many diverse ways. Not everyone is musically gifted, but you may have the gift of art or writing or teaching, and so on. Your current or past occupation may have allowed you to develop skills that may help the congregation (i.e., nursing, teaching, art, music, accounting, office work or cooking, etc.). How can you share the talent God has blessed you with?

Your gift of TREASURE is important in two ways. First, God is the giver and some percentage of what we receive should be returned to him in an act of gratitude. Secondly, there should be some sharing of our treasure with family, community and the world. Here at COA, there are many ways to share your treasures including through offering, giving to the various wider church giving drives, or to donating needed food and goods through our Giving carts.

Please remember that importance of these gifts! In the words of St Francis of Assistance, "It is in giving that we receive."



Market Basket (Grocery Cards)

Are you willing to earn **5% cashback** for our church just by purhasing your usual groceries? At absolutely no cost to you! We hope so! That's why our sale of Grocery Cards here at COA continues undaunted while COVID safety precautions continue.

On the **1**st **and 2**nd **Sundays** of each month, you may order (with payment by cash or check) Stauffers (\$50), Giant (\$50), or Weis (\$50) Grocery Cards. Some cards may be available for immediate purchase and use. Purchased cards are useable the same as cash at the appropriate grocery stores. There are a couple ways to purchase grocery cards currently:

1. You may order cards (with payment at time of order) OR (to be paid for upon receipt) to be picked up on the first 2 Sundays of the following month. Cards may be ordered in the vestibule or on the sidewalk outside on the 1st or 2nd Sundays of November as well as succeeding months, following each worship service. Simply complete an available order form and attach your payment (check payable to COA with Market Basket on the memo line) or cash.

2. You may order cards for immediate purchase and pickup (we often, but not always, have some extra cards beyond the number that have been preordered) by phoning Karen Helmeczi (*717-299-2972*) or emailing to: kjhelmeczi@gmail.com. Arrangements can be made to pick up and pay for these cards (check to COA as above or cash) on Sunday mornings or other convenient times or at the Helmeczi residence in Homestead Village (1832 Westcott Drive) very near the church or other negotiated locations.
