Update from Reopening Task Force

Hello Fellow COA members!

The Re-opening task Force continue to monitor the trends in Covid infections in our Lancaster County area as well as staying on top of the latest CDC recommendations. In September, we re-instituted the indoor mask mandate due to a steady increase in the positive cases in Lancaster County. (The positive cases were at a low of 1.1% in July but as of the middle of September, it was at 9%) The Delta variant has caused in increase in strain on hospital and nursing home staff as they work to care for increasing numbers of sick people. We also continue to stress social distancing indoors and hand sanitizing. Sunday School staff are using appropriate measures to help to keep our children safe.

No one likes wearing masks....but it it will help to protect the vulnerable members of the congregation including imuno-compromised and children unable to yet be vaccinated, then I think we are willing to hang in there. We will continue to offer outdoor service at 9:00am as long as the weather permits. On line and phone worship options continue to be available. Considerations for the upcoming Christmas Bazaar have been made. We are making plans to offer a Covid Vaccine Booster clinic thanks to our "resident pharmacist", Melissa Koehler. This will be along with a Flu Vaccine Clinic to be offered as we expect this to be an intense flu season this year.



Church Wide Book Study - Transforming Congregational Culture

We are excited for you to join in this study that so many others at COA have already found to be deeply meaningful for the church and their personal journey of faith! Of this summer's study on Anthony B. Robinson's book, Transforming Congregational Culture, congregational members have stated:

"There couldn't be a better book written for our congregation."

"This study has changed the entire way I have been looking at church."

"I have been transformed by this book, and I am not a person who reads books!"

Most significantly though has been the unified conclusion of the twenty some participants stating: "More of our congregation needs to experience this study!"

Therefore, starting the week of October 4th we will hold a new 6 week series (with a one week break the week of October 25th) on Robinson's book.

To engage as many people as possible there are three options for participation:

- In person: Sundays from 10:00-10:50am or Wednesdays from 1:00-2:30pm
- By Zoom: Thursdays from 7-8pm

Please register for the day you will primarily seek to attend by clicking the links above, signing up in the narthex, or contacting the church office. You are welcome to switch between sessions as needed, and if you can't make a week simply join in the following week.

Note: Wednesday's session is specifically designed with non-readers in mind. Its extended time will allow more teaching of the book content in addition to the group discussions held in the other sessions. Therefore the book is recommended, but optional for Wednesday sessions.

If attending Sunday or Thursday sessions, be sure to get the book: <u>Transforming Congregational Culture</u> by Anthony B. Robinson. You can pick up one from the church or you can order a used copy from Amazon (for under \$10) or any other used book retailer. To prepare for the first session, read the chapter one and two before arriving.

Mobile Giving: GivePlus+ App Deactivated September 30th



Our e-giving provider has made a major update to their mobile giving app. The update is resulting in the GivePlus+ mobile app being replaced with the Vanco Mobile app. We are not changing companies. Therefore all of your giving information, scheduled gifts, and login information is remaining the same. The only difference is if you are using the GivePlus+ mobile app you will need to download the new Vanco Mobile App.

The new Vanco Mobile app is a free download from either the Apple App store or Google Play store. Once downloaded, log in and search for "Church of the Apostles."

If you directly access e-giving through the church website there is nothing about this change that impacts you.

Realm - Insights from Help Session

We have learned a lot through the September in person help sessions. Here are some of the highlights that will likely be a help to you.

What is Realm?

Realm is a computer software program designed to be a resource to members, leaders and church staff.

For Members: Realm provides you with immediate access to up-to-date information (like the church directory, information about giving, and very soon information on upcoming events) and the resources to easily communicate with others in the church. We are also developing the ability for you to join ministry groups and to volunteer for ministry opportunities directly through Realm.

For Leaders: Realm will provide you with tools to work with you team (from taking attendance, sending reminders, sharing resources, and scheduling events). Plus it will help you identify people potentially interested in serving with one of your ministry activities.

For Staff: Realm is providing you with a comprehensive database to organization your ministry with members, guests, and other ministry partners.

How Do I Signup?

Because Realm is internet based, you need to provide current email address to the church office. Once we have a current email address, we will send you an invite from Realm. If you have any difficulties with the initial login process, contact the office. The initial setup is where we have seen the most questions. Note: only members are being provided logins to Realm.

How Do I Find the Login Page After Creating My Account?

If you didn't save or bookmark the page when first logging in, bookmark this address: https://onrealm.org/apostlesucc/SignIn and you will easily find it every time.

Keep on asking us questions as we continue to share with you this great resource.

Community Outreach

Market Basket (Grocery Cards)

Are you willing to earn **5% cashback** for our church just by purhasing your usual groceries? At absolutely no cost to you! We hope so! That's why our sale of Grocery Cards here at COA continues undaunted while covid safety precautions continue.

On the 1st and 2nd Sundays of each month, you may order (with payment by cash or check) Stouffers (\$50), Giant (\$50), or Weis (\$50) Grocery Cards. Some cards may be available for immediate purchase and use. Purchased cards are useable the same as cash at the appropriate grocery stores. The benefit is that the church gets a 5% return from our bulk purchases of cards. These additional funds are then used to support our Outreach programs. There are a couple ways to purchase grocery cards currently:

- 1. You may order cards (with payment at time of order) OR (to be paid for upon receipt) to be picked up on the first 2 Sundays of the following month. Cards may be ordered in the vestibule or on the sidewalk outside on the 1st or 2nd Sundays of October as well as succeeding months, following each worship service. Simply complete an available order form and attach your payment (check payable to COA with Market Basket on the memo line) or cash.
- 2. You may order cards for immediate purchase and pickup (we often, but not always, have some extra cards beyond the number that have been pre-ordered) by phoning Karen Helmeczi (717-299-2972) or emailing to: kjhelmeczi@gmail.com. Arrangements can be made to pick up and pay for these cards (check to COA as above or cash) on Sunday mornings or other convenient times or at the Helmeczi residence in Homestead Village (1832 Westcott Drive) very near the church or other negotiated locations.

October Special Offering: Neighbors in Need (NiN)

Neighbors in Need (October 3, also during the month) is a special mission offering of the United Church of Christ that supports ministries of Justice and compassion throughout the United States. One-third of NIN funds support the Council for American Indian Ministry. Two-thirds of this offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries. NiN grants are awarded to UCC churches and organizations doing justice work in their communities. This year, special consideration will be given to projects focusing on serving our immigrant neighbors and communities. At present, nearly 100% of the monies raised from NiN SMO(Special Mission Offering) are used to fund our mission projects and programs which include our largest commitments to NIN grants and CAIM.

Some funds from NIN have been put in a Covid-19 relief fund to assist those greatly impacted by the pandemic. These ministries are especially crucial during this time of Covid19. The Native Americans and immigrant populations are being hit especially hard with this virus and the economic downfall that it has brought. Please give generously to help our brothers and sisters in need.

COVENANT FOR CHRISTIAN LIVING

Drafted: June, 7, 2021

Adopted by Council: July 19, 2021

Relying on the Grace of God...

We will do our best to live the fruits of the spirit... love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control [Galatians 5:22-23a], remembering that this is Christ's church and we are members, servants and stewards of His church and His community

- We will extend hospitality to all people and create an environment of inclusiveness
- We commit to communicating openly about the life of the church and its mission
- We will discipline ourselves to pray daily for this body
- We will actively seek opportunities to work for the good of all [Galatians 6:10]
- We realize our words and our behaviors can communicate many things. We interpret what we see and hear based on our own many experiences: our faith, our fears, our visible and invisible loyalties, our sense of self and our sense of others
- We will celebrate and nurture the gifts and graces each of us brings to the table, recognizing that a healthy community requires a variety of gifts and that we have all been blessed in different ways [1st Corinthians 12]
- We believe that everyone is trying her/his best to bring glory to God through Church of the Apostles
- We will listen to, invite and encourage all points of view
- We will ask questions to clarify our understanding, or to raise another point of view, but not to put others down
- We will feel free to engage in critical discussion, saying what's on our minds, with no hidden agendas, speaking the truth in love [Ephesians 4:15]
- We will recognize our mutual accountability for success, supporting group decisions regardless of our own perspectives, striving to achieve consensus
- We will encourage our brothers and sisters who try to engage in supportive conversations directly [Galatians 5:19-21]
- We will speak only for ourselves unless asked to bring an issue to the group on behalf of another person
- We will speak directly with anyone who feels that we have offended her/him, or anyone we feel has offended us, privately, in a timely manner. We will not talk to anyone else about it unless we have agreed to ask a witness to be present. When we make mistakes, we will admit them and make amends [Matthew 5:21-24, Matthew 18:15-20].
