Pastor's Corner



A Musical Note

Protestant denominations celebrate Reformation Day each year on Oct 31st. This date marks the day in 1517 that Martin Luther nailed his ninety-five theses to a church door in Wittenberg, Germany, which protested practices of the Catholic Church, thereby sparking the Reformation. Other European countries followed suit with similar movements, most notable of which is the Calvinist movement of the 16th century, established by the Frenchman, John Calvin. The Genevan Psalter is a compilation of communal psalms intended to be sung in the vernacular. This collection, created in response to Calvin's teaching, features a hymn tune that we still sing titled Old Hundredth.

Old Hundredth appears in Protestant hymnals with various text settings. It is in our own Chalice hymnal a total of three times. Originally associated with Psalm 134 when it was published in the Genevan Psalter, Old Hundredth receives its current name due to the connection with Psalm 100 titled "All People That On Earth Do Dwell." Another text sung to Old Hundredth is "Praise God, From Whom All Blessings Flow," commonly known as the Doxology. While these have become standard hymns over the years, they were created in a time of radical reforming in the church, which reshaped future Christian theology and practices.

- Multi-media artist and storyteller Bill Hager and his troupe will return to Church of the Apostles on Oct. 21st, 2023 at 7PM in the sanctuary for a special double feature premier of two tales. Mr. Hager will tell the stories of "Medusa and the Pearl of Poseidon" and "Bridgid O'Callahan and the Turquoise Prince" and then talk about the behind the scenes process that went into the creation of both the oral and photographic stories.
- Mountain dulcimerist Dave Haas will perform a program of dulcimer music on Nov. 5th, 2023 at 3PM in the sanctuary. Mr. Haas is a popular dulcimer instructor and jam leader at music festivals in the U.S. and abroad, and has published numerous instructional materials for the instrument.
- Former Apostles' Handbell Director Ron Bellamy and the Philadelphia Handbell Ensemble, which he currently directs, will perform a Christmas program on Dec. 2nd, 2023 at 3PM in the sanctuary. This is one of the premier handbell ensembles in the tri-state area comprised of advanced-level ringers from Pennsylvania, New Jersey, and Delaware.

A freewill offering will be taken in lieu of tickets for these concerts.
