Thank-You To Our Implementation Team



Becoming An Apostle

If you are interested in exploring membership with Church of the Apostles, join Pastor Kuhn for either the 10-11 AM or 12-1 PM session in Rm 304, for four meetings on September 18, October 9, October 23, and November 13 towards membership. Together we will deepen faith, build connections, and discern God's leading. Those interested may register on Realm or by calling the church office.



The church consulting organization – Agile Church – will begin its work with COA in September. Church of the Apostles will receive guidance from the Agile Church group to determine actions our Church can take to promote growth in both membership and church attendance.

Agile Church comes highly recommended by other UCC Churches we have spoken with concerning their approach and follow-through in helping to focus key church functions (promoting church to neighbors, welcoming visitors, follow-up with visitors, etc.). The Agile Church organization is headed by Rev. Michael Piazza who, in addition to his work with Agile Church, also serves as Senior Pastor at a UCC Church in New York City. He has written numerous books dealing with revitalizing main-stream Protestant churches and putting them back on a growth path.

There will be two phases to this initiative:

- Healthy Church Checkup Agile Church will visit COA September 29th through October 2nd to
 meet with Church leadership and other church membership to understand the church policy/practices
 and attend Sunday services. We will receive a 20 to 40-page report from them recommending actions we should take to revitalize specific areas of our church.
- **Jeremiah Project** The focus of this engagement is to work with the congregation to define a mission statement for the church which energizes the congregation overall and becomes what the church is known for. A decision to proceed with this initiative will be based on a vote at our November Congregational Meeting. If we decide to proceed, this effort will be undertaken in the first half of 2023.

A key date to keep in mind is September 11th where a 5-minute video presentation by Rev. Piazza on what to expect from their consultation will be included in the 10 AM combined Church service. Following our service, a 15-minute video presentation will be apart of the "Pot Luck" luncheon. During the luncheon, there will be time for you to ask questions of Church Council about this initiative. We deeply hope that you will join us for these special events and join in the conversation about our church's future.

On Saturday, October 1st COA will be hosting Hybrid Hope: Church of the Future for Churches with a Future, an interactive workshop for pastors, leadership teams, key volunteers and congregations who are interested in the future of the church. Rev. Michael Piazza will be leading this workshop and community involvement is encouraged. Registration is required through Realm for this event with a \$5 cost



A MUSICAL NOTE

WITH LARS POTTEIGER

There is a hymn for every season of life. We sing many types of hymns; hymns to celebrate our joys, hymns of lament and mourning, and hymns of hope. Hope is not always easy to find in our lives. To hope is to see the possibility of things to come even when we feel stuck. Hope encourages us to press forward and place one foot in front ofthe other.

"Abide With Me" is a classic hymn that encourages us in our despair, written by the Scottish Anglican Henry Francis Lyte. Lyte wrote this hymn while he was dying from tuberculosis. The hymn text was inspired by Luke 24:29, where the risen Christ appears on the road to Emmaus. But they constrained him, saying, "Abide with us: for it is toward evening, and the day is far spent". And he went in to tarry with them. Luke 24:29 KJV.

Lyte originally penned the opening phrase "Abide With Me" about twenty years prior to completing the hymn while visiting a friend on his deathbed. The friend kept uttering this phrase and Lyte was compelled to begin writing this beloved hymn. It took Lyte facing his own mortality to complete the hymn, which was first sung at his funeral.

JONATHAN PAREDES selected Fellow of Nollau Life Institute. The Nollau Life Institute was established by the Council for Health and Human Service Ministries of the UCC. It aims to introduce future leaders in the Church to the needs of people served by the 400 agency members of CHHSM. Those include Hospitals, Children's Services, Community Centers, & Senior Citizen's Communities. These agencies were founded as missions of the Denomination, Conferences, and individual UCC churches. Together they provide \$877 million in uncompensated services a year. CHHSM provides training, networking, strategic planning and consultation to member agencies. In late June, Jonathan spent a week of intensive study with the Nollau Life Institute in Wisconsin. Church of Apostles was able, through the Schellenberger-Rader endowment funds, to assist with his costs to attend. "The most meaningful thing was the hopefulness for the future." There was time to learn, stop to think, reflect and internalize new concepts. His small group, "five randomly picked strangers, with their own life stories and own ministry experience from diverse locations in the US came together in a week and forged a bond that is life-giving and affirming" He looks forward to the exposures during the remainder of this academic year, and "how that will influence my perspective and ministry work going forward...I thank Church of Apostles for the investment in my ministry".

Refugee Families Update

Our two new refugee families are settling into Lancaster and seem to enjoy all it has to offer. Visits to Rader Park, Lancaster Central Market, orientation at the children's schools, soccer practice, attending church activities at the Congolese Friends Church, and the start of the school year are all keeping them busy. Vincent, the oldest, is playing soccer on the Jr. High team at McCaskey. He and Tosha, his cousin, have completed the "Earn-a-Bike" program at The Common Wheel, a bicycle shop in Reservoir Park. Twice a week for four weeks, they learned how to repair used bikes that they had chosen, earning the bike, a helmet, lock, and light. They are guite excited to have their bikes at home now. In September, Shukuru and cousin Jango will get the chance to also earn their bikes through this program. Tosha is attending Wheatland Middle School; her siblings Jango and Auser go to Lafayette Elementary. Vincent is at McCaskey and his brother Shukuru is at Wharton. They are enrolled as English Language Learners (ELL) and will receive a great amount of attention from caring teachers in learning English. We are so anxious to see how they progress!

The Welcome Team and the refugee families are so appreciative of all the kind donations that you have provided. From gifts of bed linens to housewares, from furniture to monetary donations, it shows what a generous and caring congregation we have at Church of Apostles. Thank you from the bottom of our hearts for helping these two families get a start at a new life, free from fear and violence.
