### **Pastor's Corner**

Where is Christ leading your heart? This has been the theme of our season of Lent which invited us to be listening more closely, "letting go" or "giving up" the pieces of our lives which we try to hide or pretend do not exist, and "take up" or "be up to" something good as an act of our faith in Jesus Christ.

On Ash Wednesday, I talked about "giving up" some of the muck of our lives that prevents us from fully being the people God created us to be. When we are weighed down by regret, embarrassment or shame, we may miss opportunities to make a difference. We do not need to consider ourselves less than enough because of choices we made or circumstances that happened to us. So, forgiving ourselves may be our first step. Remembering not to judge each other may be another step. Allowing ourselves to recognize and feel the grief we carry over disappointments and losses will move the grief to a level where it carries less power over us. All of these actions are part of the descending path Christ asks us to "walk" with him, so that we may "rise" with him to the hope, peace, love and joy of life God intends.

This is the time to acknowledge our heartbreaks and be present with one another as a community. Be a listening ear to one who is struggling and seek out another to be your listening ear. Consider calling someone from our Compassion Team as they are committed to confidentiality and have identified their willingness to listen. Or if you are a listening ear for someone else and need support or resources, call or stop by the Compassion Corner to find other places where help can be found.

Our mission is to welcome and include people as they are! May we compassionately care for one another as well as the guest who walks in the door!

# A Musical Note

WITH LARS POTTEIGER

I was musing about some of the traditions that we use for different holidays: the Christmas tree, Thanksgiving turkey, and Easter lilies. I began to wonder how the lily has become so synonymous with the celebration of Easter. What is the connection between the two?

The lily is mentioned in the Bible in both the Old and New Testaments. Jesus mentions the flower in his Sermon on the Mount. The Song of Solomon also refers to the lily as an allegory of the relationship between God and the faithful. The lily also is a symbol of purity often associated with the Virgin Mary. Even the manner in which this plant grows is filled with Easter symbolism. The lily lies dormant as a bulb and sprouts to produce a beautiful, sweet smelling flower, akin to Christ's resurrection on Easter morning. And the way the flowers grow on the Easter lily resemble trumpets; instruments that are often used to add to the festive nature of the Easter celebration.
