A Musical Note

Our theme in worship for the Easter season this year is "home." One part of life that I've always felt was synonymous with home is family. Growing up, our home was a place where my immediate family would do our various day to day activities and extended family would often gather for holidays. My last living grandparent passed away three years ago. While she was not a blood relative, she was family to me, nonetheless.

I found it confusing to navigate this relationship as a child. Why did I have five grandparents when most of my friends had four? Why did we have to celebrate holidays separately with some of our grandparents and not others? As I became older I learned more about my maternal grandparents' divorce: my biological grandfather remarried and his new wife moved from Ohio to live with him in the Reading area. I further discovered that Grandma Hinkle had children and grandchildren from her previous marriage in Ohio. This knowledge helped reshape my idea of what family can be. Grandma Hinkle showed me all the love, support, and encouragement that my other biological grandparents did, especially in regards to my musical pursuits. She was a gifted musician and took her role as a grandparent and musical mentor very seriously in a manner that was both loving and compassionate.

We define home and family in different ways depending on our life experiences. How we do this helps to give us a sense of grounding, meaning, and helps to define who we are. To quote part of Morris Chapman's "The Family Prayer Song":

Staying together, praying together
Any storm we can weather, trusting in God's Word.
We need each other, fathers and mothers,
Sisters and brothers in harmony and love.

Twice a month from October to April we meet at Pucillo Gymnasium to keep our members connected and main-



tain our skills while learning new ones along the way.

Believe it or not, we are not just about being in our kayaks. The winter months give us an opportunity to enhance other necessary skills as well. In February we hosted a Wilderness First Aid Class, including a knots and ropes class in the Youth Center. There are many scenarios we put



ourselves in where emergency responders are not less than 10 minutes away, but perhaps hours away. This class gave us all the skills we need to get through the toughest of emergency situations in the wilderness.

In March we hosted our annual Safety Standdown in the Youth

Center. This class is all about safety protocols on and off the water. Anything from ensuring our gear is in good condition and is reliable; to creating float plans to ensure we thought through every possible scenario when taking individuals out on the water.


