### **Pastor's Corner**

Since our Healthy Church Check-up in the fall of 2022, we have been on a path towards being a healthier congregation. Some of the actions which we have already taken because of the check-up were the congregational work to discern a new Mission & Vision statement, the merging of our two services into one, and the redecoration of our lobby and parlor areas. Another major piece of the check-up was to reorganize our structure to remove the bureaucracy which had crept into it. Our current structure was put in place when we were a much larger congregation and has become an obstacle to timely and efficient decision making.

The goal of our re-structuring is to free members to be involved in ministries rather than administration which is why we have been encouraging commissions to consider how they could become ministry teams. We want and need ministries to still happen, but ministries do not need a formal meeting and recorded minutes to be effective. Actually, they are more effective with their time spent doing the work of the ministry. This is why there has been conversation about commissions "going away," although we will still need to have a finance committee and a property committee.

Administration will be handled by staff who are paid and can be held responsible for getting the work done. This is one of the reasons behind hiring a Church Administrator, a position included in the 2024 budget approved by the congregation last November, who will oversee the "business-end" of our work

together while I will oversee the ministries. Ministries will report to me when they have done work which can be as easy as a text or email and I will report In This Issue on all ministry work to the Board. For this to take place, we will need a new set of by-laws which the Council is hoping to have to you in the fall for a vote at our November congregational meeting.

Our Penn Central Conference is also considering a structure change by merging with the Penn West, Penn Northeast, and Pennsylvania Southeast Conferences to become one Keystone Conference. This is the topic of our Annual Meeting at Penn State on June 7-9<sup>th</sup>. In my absence on June 9<sup>th</sup>, the Rev. Milton Gockley will be leading worship and preaching.

## A Message from the Executive Committee

About fifteen years ago, I had a female relative who was in high school when she was told by her church that homosexuality was a sin and that anyone who was gay was going to Hell. Struggling with coming to terms with her homosexuality, she made plans to kill herself. Luckily one of her friends told her parents and they were able to intervene. She checked herself into a mental health facility two hours from her home – the only available bed in the entire state – and worked through her depression and suicidal thoughts. This year, she happily married her partner.

In 2015, the Supreme Court ruled that same-sex marriages needed to be recognized in the US. But in today's climate, I fear there is organized oppression being focused against the LGBTQA+ community and the Supreme Court has openly stated that perhaps the laws enabling same-sex marriage should be reevaluated.

Homosexuality existed in Jesus' time, but he did not explicitly speak against it. Gender roles were very different back in those times. Biblical text that discusses homosexuality is more about oppression and taking advantage of those with less power which directly correlates with Jesus' teachings about not taking advantage of the poor and those who were marginalized by the "system." Jesus always taught inclusivity, not exclusion.

The Trevor Project estimates that more than 1.8 million LGBTQ+ people between the ages of 13-24 seriously consider suicide every year in the US and at least one attempts suicide every 45 seconds. Within the last year, three transgender young adults in Lancaster committed suicide. If we believe that God knows us, has knit us together in our mother's womb, do we believe that God could make a mistake in our sexuality? How do we act within Jesus' teachings and make our congregation and our campus a safe place for all? My grandson, Hunter, wanted one of the Safe buttons put on his church nametag. To explain to him what it meant, I told him that by wearing it, he was telling other people that he was a nice person and would not make fun of anyone. How can we also be people who are nice and welcoming to all?





# A Musical Note

WITH LARS POTTEIGER

Care of the natural environment is an act of stewardship; caring for God's green earth and natural spaces are gifts that we should pass on to future generations. While there are no easy solutions to being more "green" in day-to-day life, modern living offers many conveniences that most of us would not want to give up entirely (most of us aren't willing to give up electricity or our automobiles), we can be more mindful of our used resources and find better ways to build a more sustainable future. Our theme in summer worship is to examine how we as a church can be better stewards of the environment. One of my favorite hymns, Henry Van Dyke's "Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee", uses a beautifully poetic text to describe nature and God's creation.

Van Dyke was a Presbyterian minister and an English professor. Inspired by the beauty of the Berkshire Mountains in Massachusetts, he wrote the text for this joyous hymn in 1907. Van Dyke insisted that this text was to be sung to the melody of Ludwig van Beethoven's final movement of his Ninth Symphony. The poetry he penned celebrates the awesome wonder found in God's creation, while creating wonderful juxtapositions of Christian faith with the natural world through metaphor and simile. Some of my favorite imagery in this hymn occurs in the first verse:

Joyful, joyful, we adore Thee
God of glory, Lord of love
Hearts unfold like flow'rs before Thee
Op'ning to the Sun above
Melt the clouds of sin and sadness
drive the dark of doubt away
Giver of immortal gladness
fill us with the light of day

Van Dyke reflected on his inspiration for writing the text of this hymn: "These verses are simple expressions of common Christian feelings and desires in this present time—hymns of today that may be sung together by people who know the thought of the age, and are not afraid that any truth of science will destroy religion, or any revolution on earth overthrow the kingdom of heaven. Therefore this is a hymn of trust and joy and hope."
