Pastor's Corner

Welcome to summer and to our budget and by-laws writing season! Actually, when the word "by-laws" is said in our midst, it tends to stop the conversation and almost evoke panic. We have a history of rewriting the by-laws. The most recent effort was in 2012 and became a herculean effort. So, I understand why we can be reticent to go there again; however, our by-laws require the bureaucracy we are trying to eliminate. It is my hope that the new by-laws will be a stream-lined set which merely define our structure and how the power is shared.

When it comes to the budget process, it will be quite different without the commissions submitting budgets to the Council. Instead we will be working towards a zero-deficit budget, which will take some years, but which uses your giving, our rental income, conduit funds, and our special and general endowments to fund our ministries. Our ministry priorities will be based on our Vision to be "inclusive and generous, advocates for social justice and environmental care, and a safe space for those who feel afraid or powerless." We also need to acknowledge, that as our facility turns 50 years old, there are updates and repairs which need to take place. It is our plan to get a separate improvements budget and capital campaign to you by the first quarter of 2025.

I realize these are significant changes in how we function as a church; however, the systems we have relied on for many years are no longer meeting the challenges before us. We will be working to be transparent with you and hope that you will support the changes as we continue to be faithful to Christ's call on our life together.

Kuhn cherished the opportunity to engage with such a vibrant community of faith.

Penn Central Conference Annual Meeting Recap

This year our annual meeting was in State College on June 7-9th. During the gathering, we heard from our Conference Minister, the Rev. Dr. Carrie Call, about the state of our conference. Overall, she made the point that we are a conference made up of small churches. We currently have 167 churches with an average membership of 135 and an average worship attendance of 48. Unfortunately, 23% of our churches no longer financially support our conference or denomination; however, we are one of 53 churches in the conference who are 5 for 5 congregations. This means that we financially support the five offerings of the United Church of Christ (Our Churches Wider Mission, One Great Hour of Sharing, Strengthen the Church, Neighbors in Need, and the Christmas Fund). Last year our donation to the conference was \$52,451. It was also named that there are 100% scholarships for any UCC member wishing to pursue a Master's level degree in religious studies in Lancaster.

This year we were joined by the Penn West, Penn Northeast, and Pennsylvania Southeast conferences as we continued our conversation about merging into one Keystone conference. Both the joys and challenges of the merger were raised. With the challenges, we were asked to consider possible steps to minimize any adverse effects and ideas were given. The actual vote to merge will be this fall on November 9th. If any conference votes against the merger, it will not move forward. If there is a positive vote, the motion to merge will be put to our General Synod in June 2025.



A Musical Note

WITH LARS POTTEIGER

All things bright and beautiful, all creatures great and small, all things wise and wonderful, the Lord God made them all.

In continuing with our summer theme of how we can be better stewards of the environment, I'd like to take a look at the history of another hymn that features themes of nature and creation in its text. "All Things Bright and Beautiful" is a cherished hymn written by Cecil Frances Alexander, an Irish hymn writer and poet, in 1848. Published in her collection Hymns for Little Children, the hymn was intended to teach children about the opening lines of the Apostles' Creed: "Maker of heaven and earth." The lyrics celebrate the splendor of God's creation, using simple and joyful language to describe various aspects of nature as expressions of divine craftsmanship.

The hymn has been set to several tunes, with "Royal Oak," adapted by Martin Shaw in 1915 being the most recognized. Its vivid imagery, message of gratitude, and reverence for God have made it a staple in Christian worship. Cecil Frances Alexander, who also wrote other well-known hymns like "Once in Royal David's City," has ensured the hymn's place in numerous hymnals, recordings, and adaptations, maintaining its popularity across generations.
