Pastor's Corner

Jesus answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind and your neighbor as yourself." – Luke 10:27

As Christians, we follow the wisdom and teachings of Jesus Christ as recorded in the Gospels. While we read and value all the books of the Bible as divinely inspired texts that help us begin to understand the nature of God and God's calling for us, our primary focus is on the Gospels, followed by the letters of Paul. This is how we orient our lives as disciples of Christ.

This fall, we will be exploring some of the most important scriptures of the Bible. These passages reflect the words of Jesus and the wisdom of Paul. These are teachings that stand in stark contrast to the ideology of White Christian Nationalism, which has aligned itself with specific political agendas. It's essential for us to recognize this distinction and reaffirm our identity as followers of Jesus Christ.

In short, White Christian Nationalism is driven by a desire for power—social, economic, and political. However, it does not follow the teachings or example of Jesus, who neither sought power nor challenged the political authority of his time, the Roman Empire. Where White Christian Nationalism excludes, Jesus includes and welcomes. Where White Christian Nationalism seeks to control, Jesus liberates and heals. While White Christian Nationalism aims to establish an earthly empire, Jesus focused on building the kingdom of God, founded on love.

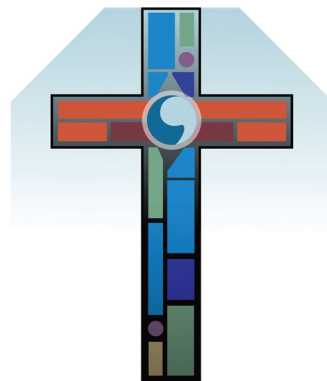
I write this because I believe White Christian Nationalism is the greatest threat to Christianity in a millennium, and it is present within churches in our community that identify as Christian. This fall, we will focus on some of the most important scriptures to remind ourselves that we are "Linked by Love."

A Message from the Council Secretary

For the past several weeks, Council has been asking the congregation what questions they have related to the change of the Church Bylaws. At the time of this writing, no questions have been submitted. During September and October there will be question and answer sessions sponsored by the Council following worship. To get things started, here are a few questions I have had.



Question: I have heard that commissions are going away, is this true?

Answer: The traditional commission structure is changing to ministry teams. The teams will focus on specific projects that relate to the Vision and Mission of the church. Teams will be flexible and report to the Pastor or Church Administrator. Property Commission and Stewardship Commission will continue to function as standing committees of the Council. They will be known as Property; under the direction of the Property Manager, Eric MacLaren and Church Administrator, Melissa Kosman and Finance under the direction of the Church Administrator, Melissa Kosman.

Question: Is anything else changing with the structure of leadership?

Answer: The proposal is to reduce the number of people on Church Council to 9 members in 2025 and then 7 members in 2026. This change would be voted on by the congregation. The reduction of members is happening naturally by attrition of current members. Another change in leadership structure will be the elimination of the Executive Committee. Council will continue to have officers to represent the congregation. A third major piece is the elimination of the Spiritual Council as a standing committee. A group will be selected by the Council President and Pastor and be affirmed by the congregation to mediate relationship conflicts.

Hopefully, this may spark some questions you may have. As always submit questions to the Church Office or write them on the Welcome Cards during the weekly services.

Are you looking for a meaningful way to make a difference in our community? However, they need our help to get to and from practice on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday evenings. Practice takes place from 6:00-7:30 PM at Jackson Middle School on S. Ann St. We're looking for 3-6 volunteers who can commit to driving one way (or both ways) for a specific evening each week. For example, Volunteer A would drive them to practice every Monday, and Volunteer B would drive them home every Monday, and so on. Without drivers, they would have to walk about two miles to practice, so your support would make a significant impact on their lives.

The Church of the Apostles Children's Library will be open for business starting in September! Located in Room 207, the library will be unlocked every Sunday for children to browse and sign out books.

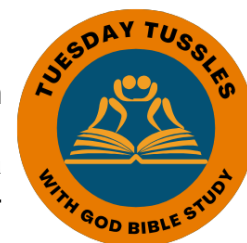
Here's how it's organized:

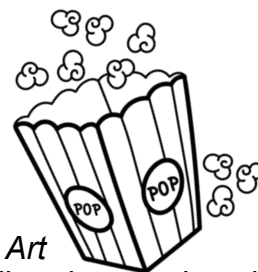
Seeds of Hope Garden Makes a Big Impact This Summer

We are offering four tot (2-year old) classes, three classes of 3 and 4-year old, and three classes of Pre-Kindergarten. We have many of our amazing staff returning this year with two new additions, Brittanie Grazer (MWF Tot Teacher) and Erin Sardina (4 day Pre-K assistant).

As a reminder, our school drop-off takes place from 8:55AM-9:15AM in both the front and back parking lots and pick-up times are from 11:20AM-11:35AM. Please be aware that this will be a busy time around the church property.

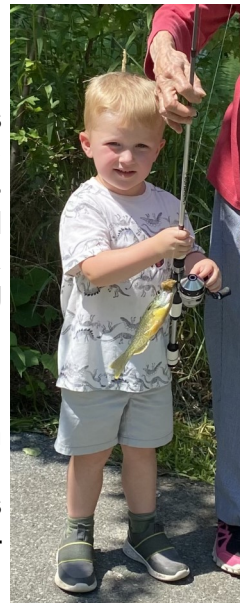
Discovering Pond Life at Rader Park

This fall, our worship theme centers on how we are connected by love through faith, embracing Jesus' teaching to love our neighbors. When I think of this Christ-like love, many hymns come to mind. One of my favorites was written in the 1960s by a Catholic priest from Chicago who needed a song but couldn't find the right one—so he wrote his own.

"They'll Know We Are Christians by Our Love" is a contemporary Christian hymn written by Peter Scholtes. The song was inspired by John 13:35, where Jesus tells his disciples, "By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." Scholtes wrote the hymn in one day for the youth choir he directed, intending it for a series of ecumenical and interracial events. The song serves as a simple yet powerful anthem for unity and love, reflecting the spirit of the civil rights movement and the broader social changes of the era. Its folk-like melody and repetitive lyrics made it easy to sing and remember, quickly becoming popular in both Catholic and Protestant churches. The song's enduring message continues to resonate with congregations around the world.
