Pastor's Corner



As we hear members discussing the changes in governance and bylaws, a concern seems to be emerging that the staff is taking control of the church. This is not accurate. Under the new system, it is the Board or Council that will make the decisions about the church's direction and ensure both the congregation and staff work toward our vision and mission as guided by Christ.

In this new structure, the Church Administrator will manage day-to-day operations and the Senior Pastor will support and oversee the ministries of the congregation. However, the Council will hold them accountable for managing the church efficiently, keeping an eye on expenses, and working toward the church's vision and mission. The Council will also provide guidance, support, feedback, warnings, and encouragement to the Senior Pastor and Church Administrator.

The Council will continue to serve as the fiduciary body, overseeing all legal and financial matters responsibly. They will ensure that the congregation's resources are used effectively and align with the church's vision and mission. They will also plan for the future, something that has not been done.

Although this structure is new for us, it is commonly used by many congregations and was recommended by the Agile In This Issue Church consultants. For more information, refer to Chapter 5, "The Job of the Board," in Dan Hotchkiss's book Governance • A Message from the & Ministry. A copy is available in the church office, and the chapter can also be provided electronically upon request.

Greetings Apostles Family,



This month, our song is "You've Got A Friend" by singer-songwriter Carole King. King wrote "You've Got a Friend" in 1971, a heartfelt song about unconditional support and friendship. It was first featured on her landmark album Tapestry, which became one of the best-selling albums of all time. That same year, James Taylor also recorded the song for his album Mud Slide Slim and the Blue Horizon, turning it into a hit single that reached No. 1 on the Billboard Hot 100 and won a Grammy Award. The song's simple, comforting message and soulful melody have made it a timeless anthem of friendship, covered by many artists over the years.

December 8th at 3 PM: Formed in 2011, the Vintage Brass Quintet is active in the greater Harrisburg, PA area. 
Compassion Corner
