

A Little Love from History. Did you know the first recorded Valentine's Day message dates back to 1415? Charles, Duke of Orleans, wrote to his wife while imprisoned in the Tower of London. In his poem he wrote "I am already sick of love, My very gentle Valentine."

What is Love? Love is an emotion, an action, a commitment. It's the bond that connects families, our friendship, and the selfless giving that shows our devotion to others. In the Bible, we find different kinds of love, each demonstrating unique

ways in which we can relate to one another.

A MUSICAL NOTE

Saint Valentine is a figure shrouded in mystery, with his historical details blending legend and fact. He was a Christian martyr believed to have lived in the 3rd century during the reign of Roman Emperor Claudius II. According to tradition, Valentine defied the emperor's ban on Christian marriages by secretly officiating weddings for Christian couples, earning his arrest. While imprisoned, he is said to have performed miraculous acts, including restoring the sight of a jailer's daughter, with whom he may have exchanged a note signed "Your Valentine" before his execution on February 14. Although no traditional or ancient songs are specifically linked to Saint Valentine, many modern songs and compositions reference his name or the themes of love and romance associated with Valentine's Day.

This February, we're excited to return to the book of Acts to continue exploring the story of the early church. ROOTED youth is where faith, fun, and community come together!


PRIMARY FAITH FORMATION

Homemade Latkes

On January 26th, the Rooted in Faith class for grades 3-8 kicked off 2025 with their first kitchen takeover! Here's one of the recipes they created - give it a try at home!

Potato Latkes with Onion

- 2 Ibs Russet Potatos
- 3 T Flour (Sub 3T Cornstarch for GF)
- 1 Medium Onion
- 1 T Salt

3 Eggs

- Cooking Oil
- 1. Grate potatoes and onion into a colander over a bowl. Squeeze out excess moisture, letting it drain into the bowl. Set the colander on a plate to catch any remaining moisture.
- **2.** Let the liquid in the bowl settle, then pour off the water, leaving the starch at the bottom.
- **3.** Beat eggs into the starch, then mix in flour/cornstarch and salt. Add the potato-onion mixture and combine.
- **4.** Heat oil in a pan over medium-high heat (or 350°F for an electric skillet). Form small handfuls of the mixture, squeeze out moisture, place in the pan, and flatten slightly.
- **5.** Cook a few minutes per side until golden brown. Drain on paper towels and serve hot with applesauce, sour cream, or feta.
