

As we approach 2025, Church of the Apostles begins a year of celebration and anticipation, reflecting on our past and looking forward to what lies ahead. 

# A MUSICAL NOTE

### With Music Director, Lars Potteiger

As with gladness men of old
Did the guiding star behold;
As with joy they hailed its light,
Leading onward, beaming bright,
So, most gracious Lord, may we
Ever more be led to thee.

"As With Gladness Men of Old" is a delightful hymn traditionally sung during Christmas and Epiphany. Written in 1858 by English hymnist William Chatterton Dix, the hymn emerged from a period of personal illness and deep spiritual reflection. Inspired by the biblical account of the Magi in Matthew 2:1–12, it draws a poignant parallel between the Magi's journey to worship the Christ child and the spiritual journey of believers seeking to honor Christ. The hymn is set to the tune Dix, originally composed by Conrad Kocher in 1838 and later adapted by William Henry Monk. The same melody is also used for the hymn "For the Beauty of the Earth."

## A Fond Farewell to the Generina Family

It is with heartfelt sadness that the Refugee Welcome Team announces the upcoming move of the Generina family from Lancaster to Macon, Georgia.

The Refugee Welcome Team was established in early 2022 in response to the ongoing humanitarian crisis in the Democratic Republic of the Congo, where decades of armed conflict, human rights violations, and gender-based violence have displaced over 7 million people. With the assistance of Church World Services, the Bilombele family arrived in Lancaster in May 2022, followed by the Generina family—Mlasi and her four children—in June of that year.

For two years, the generosity of our congregation has provided essential support to both families, including Christmas gifts, winter coats, and rental assistance. Two extraordinary volunteers who have made a lasting impact are Linda & Tom Lewis, longtime members of COA and dedicated members of the Refugee Welcome Team. Their kindness and dedication created a sense of belonging for the families in Lancaster.

Sadly, due to job loss and challenges finding new employment in the area, Mlasi has made the difficult decision to move her family to Georgia, where her brother resides. While we are deeply saddened to see the Generina family

leave, we send them with our prayers, well wishes, and hopes for a bright future as they continue their journey in America.

If you would like to say goodbye, we invite you to write a card for the family. Cards can be dropped off at the church office and will be delivered to the Generina family through Linda Lewis.

Even as we bid farewell to the Generina family, our commitment to the Bilombele family—Bilomanga and her sons Vincent and Shukuru—remains strong. We continue to seek volunteers and financial support for the Refugee Welcome Team as we provide compassionate care to our refugee families.

### PRIMARY FAITH FORMATION


### Focusing on Jesus' Early Life & Ministry

January's Faith Formation classes will center on the early life and ministry of Jesus, with a spotlight on Luke 12:22-24 and the spiritual practice of "Help Me" prayers. Children will also enjoy learning new songs, including Wide, High, Long & Deep and God's Love is All Around.

Here's what's happening each Sunday in January:

- January 5: A tour of the church building to explore what people learn and do in different spaces.
- **January 12:** Learning about Jesus' baptism and discussing how various churches practice this sacrament. We'll also create colored sand candle holders.
- **January 19:** Discovering how Jesus brought good news to outsiders in Nazareth and practicing reading blessings.
- **January 26:** Hearing about Jesus teaching from Simon Peter's boat and inviting the fishermen to be "fishers of men." Children will enjoy a Follow Jesus hopscotch game.

We're excited for a month filled with learning, creativity, and spiritual growth as we journey through Jesus' life together!
