

COA was formed by the merger of two congregations: St John's UCC which was located on Wheatland Ave (just across Brubaker Run) and St Paul's UCC (which was located it the intersection of N. Duke St and E. Orange St in downtown Lancaster).

Rev. Glenn Rader led St John's and Rev Nevin Schellenberger led St Paul's. These two pastors had a vision for a new church that could enhance the spiritual life of it's two congregations as well as act as a community partner to further the mission of Christ in serving others.

Skeeter and I were married at St John's in 1971 and were there when the plow was being pulled to break ground for our current church. We have been blessed to see our children be baptized, grow up attending our preschool and be confirmed at COA.

Our church has grown in many ways and though it's current membership number is less than in the post-merger years, COA is a congregation that has evolved and strengthened as a vital part of the Lancaster Association and the Penn Central Conference. We have survived some internal as well as external cultural changes in these past 50 years and I am confident that we are well positioned to be here for the next 25 years and beyond.


JOIN OUR BOOK CLUB!


Book Club meets on the 2nd Tuesday of each month at 2 PM in the Narthex, and

A MUSICAL NOTE

With Music Director, Lars Potteiger

The Church of the Apostles Hymn was written by Evelyn Albertson in 1981 for our newly formed church. The lyrics reflect on the founding of our congregation and how the faith of our church's founders inspired them to establish this new community. Her original words were set to the tune of Melita. We will sing this hymn as part of our fiftieth anniversary celebration.

Melita, composed by John Bacchus Dykes in 1861, is a solemn and majestic hymn tune best known for accompanying the lyrics of *Eternal Father, Strong to Save*. Dykes, an English clergyman and accomplished organist, named the tune after the island of Melita (modern-day Malta), referencing the Apostle Paul's shipwreck as described in Acts 28. Known for his rich, harmonically expressive style, Dykes wrote over 300 hymn tunes. *Melita* remains one of his most enduring works, especially in maritime and military traditions.

What aspect of volunteering do you find most fulfilling?

Volunteering is a passion for me. It brings me joy to spread joy to others. There is so much need in our community and I know that we can not fill all of those needs but we can certainly try to fill as many as possible.

Which volunteer roles do you have at COA?

I am the chair of the Outreach Commission, which I absolutely love. My volunteer roles include managing the Apostles Caring Cart Ministry, delivering donated clothing to the HUB downtown, taking towels and pet food to the Pet Pantry, ushering once a month, and organizing food donations for the large food pantry in Landisville. I also make meals for families with new babies or those in need due to health reasons, shop and provide transportation for a church member who doesn't drive, and participate in the monthly breakfast ministry downtown. SNAPSHOTS OF OUR HISTORY: CELEBRATING 50 YEARS

In 1974, a committee was formed to review names for the merged church. The results of the voting are as follows, with 567 votes returned:

Church of the Apostles received 356 votes;

Church of the Psalms received 83 votes;

Church of the Servants received 58 votes; and

Church of the Parables received 32 votes;

In addition, 10 votes (write-in) were cast for the name Wheatland;

4 votes (write-in) were cast for other names and 24 ballots were returned with no choice indicated but with comments.

The name Church of the Apostles is a good solid name. An apostle is an ambassador, an envoy, one who represents the sender. The first intimate followers of Jesus are known as apostles. Today we are the apostles of Christ. We are charged with the responsibility of spreading the Gospel by word and deed. Both St. Paul's and St. John's were named after the apostles. John was the beloved apostle; Paul, having seen the resurrected Christ on the Damascus Road also declared himself an apostle."
