**B**efore his death, Jesus gave his disciples a powerful commandment that remains at the core of what it means to be a Christian: to love one another. For many years, our church has embraced the call to be "Sharing Christ's Love with All." Now, as we continue to grow into God's vision for us, to be inclusive and generous, advocates for social justice and environmental care, and a safe space for those who feel afraid or powerless, we are invited to reflect more deeply.

What does it mean to be inclusive today? Who in our community feels afraid or powerless? This summer, we will focus on Scripture passages where Jesus meets those who were excluded, fearful, or marginalized. In each account, Jesus challenges the cultural and religious norms of his day to bring healing and

belonging. He teaches us that love is not about judgment or distance, but about relationship, compassion, and action.

We are living in times that call us to be more intentional, more courageous, and more vocal in our faith. As followers of Christ, we are not called to elevate some while excluding others. We are called to seek justice and love boldly. Pope Leo XIV said it beautifully: We must seek together how to be a missionary Church, a Church that builds bridges, engages in dialogue, and is always open to receive with open arms everyone, everyone who needs our charity, our presence, our dialogue, and our love. In the Parable of the Good Samaritan, Jesus asked, "Who was a neighbor to the man in need?" The lawyer answered, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus responded, "Go and do likewise." (Luke 10:37)

May we ask bold questions, deepen our compassion, and follow Christ's example to love without exception.


#### JOIN OUR BOOK CLUB!

## More Than Just A Sale

#### How Our Annual Garage Sale Makes a Difference

Thanks to the generosity of our church community and the incredible work of our volunteers the April Garage Sale was a tremendous success, raising \$7,064! With additional funds carried over from last year's sale, our Garage Sale Team has thoughtfully allocated the proceeds to bless others in meaningful ways:

- \$3,532 to Church of the Apostles

#### **ROOTED IN FAITH**

#### Life Lessons From The Book of Acts

**R**OOTED in Faith (4th–8th grade Christian Formation) just wrapped up our year-long study of Acts, which chronicles the early church after Jesus's ascension. Though 2,000 years have passed, the disciples' experiences still offer meaningful lessons:

Does God let bad things happen to good people? (Acts 6:8–8:8) Bad things happen all the time—pandemics, losses, hardship. When things look hopeless, don't blame God—look for the bigger picture. Stephen's death devastated the disciples, but it led them to spread Jesus's message far beyond Jerusalem.

Who's REALLY in charge—God or us? (Acts 5:33–39, 8:1, 9:1–30) We like to think we're in control, but God often has other plans. Saul tried to stop The Way—until God chose him to be its biggest champion! Living as Jesus's followers isn't always easy, but if we're on God's side, no one can stop us.

Who gets invited to the party? (Acts 9:43–10:48) In a world of "Us vs. Them," we need to remember Jesus died for *everyone*. Sometimes even the disciples forgot, but as the late Pope Francis said: "todos, todos, todos"—everyone is welcome under Jesus's big tent.

We'll share what we've learned in a short movie during worship on June 1. For a feature-length film on these themes, check out *Soul Surfer* (2011), which we watched at our final class on May 18. ROOTED returns in September!

#### Exploring God's Truth Through Science

Starting June 15th, our primary Faith Formation class will move outside to Rader Park for an exciting summer series: "Exploring God's Truth Through Science."

## A MUSICAL NOTE

#### With Music Director, Lars Potteiger

Our worship series for June and July will explore how we, as a church, can more fully live out our mission to be an inclusive place of welcome, especially for those who feel like outsiders. As I reflect on this, I recall moments when I've felt like an outsider—and times when I may have made others feel the same. At different points, we can be both the cause and the remedy. As the Church, we are called to be a place of welcome for all. One of my favorite contemporary hymns that captures this spirit is "Gather Us In" by Marty Haugen, which we often sing as a reminder of our calling to inclusivity and hospitality.

Gather us in, the lost and forsaken; gather us in, the blind and the lame; call to us now, and we shall awaken, we shall arise at the sound of our name.

This hymn was written by Marty Haugen in 1982. A liturgical composer affiliated with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, Haugen composed the hymn to reflect themes of inclusivity, unity, and communal worship. Drawing on biblical imagery of light, hope, and belonging, the hymn invites all people—regardless of background or status—into the worship space as equals, gathered by God's love. This hymn's engaging melody and socially conscious lyrics have made it a staple in many Christian hymnals, especially for services centered on welcome, baptism, and community.


"I've always had a scientific fascination and I like learning about living things," Benja shared.
